December 1854
Friday 29

..... This day commenced with strong
No 152 Wind from the N by E steering S by W
at 4 PM set whole topsails the
Wind more moderate the middle and
latter part the Wind and Weather much
the same so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 30

..... This day commenced with strong
No 152 Wind from the N by E steering S by W
under all sail the middle and latter
part the Wind and Weather the same
saw brig steering South so ends these
24 hours

Lat 44° 04' N Long 76° 20' W

Sunday 31

..... This day commenced with the Wind
No 154 from the N by E tacked ship to the
N by E the Wind blowing fresh
took in the main sail and double
reefed the topsail the middle
and latter part the Wind and
Weather much the same
so ends these 24 hours
No observations

Monday 1

..... This day came with a gale of
No 154 Wind from the N by E tacking to
under all reefed main topsail
the middle and latter part the Wind and
Weather much the same so ends these 24 hours

Lat 43° 52' N
Long 77° 20' W

Tuesday 2

..... This day came with strong Wind from
No 154 the N by E steering S by W under double
reefed topsails the middle and latter part
calm so ends these 24 hours

Lat 42° 42' N
Long 77° 21' W

Wednesday 3

..... This day came with light Winds from
No 154 the N by E steering S by W the sent up
the foretopgallion yard and sent the
sail the Watch employed in mending
sails the middle and latter part
the Wind blowing fresh from the
N by E so ends these 24 hours
