Thursday

..... This day commenced with
No 180 Strong Winds from the E. S. E.
steering S. E. the weather thick
and raining the middle and
latter part light winds from the
S. E. steering S. E. 2 ships in sight
so ends these 24 hours Lat 39.55 N
Long 74.50 W

Friday 5

..... This day commenced with light
No 189 Winds from the S. E. steering S. E.
and fine weather the watch employed
in ships duty the middle and latter
part calm and fine weather
so ends these 24 hours Lat 38.54 N
Long 74.52 W

Saturday 6

..... This day commenced with a calm
No 190 and fine weather the watch employed
in painting boats and other small
jobs about ship the middle part
calm the latter part strong winds
from the W and heavy squalls
so ends these 24 hours
No observations

Sunday 7

..... This day came with strong winds
No 191 from the W and heavy squalls
standing on the wind on different
tasks the weather thick and raining
the middle and latter part the wind
light from the W. N. W. and fine weather
steering S. E. so ends these 24 hours
Lat 34.15 N
Long 73.56 W

Monday 8

..... This day commenced with light winds
No 192 from the W. N. W. steering S. E. for Saint
marg's Island fine weather 2 ships in
sight steering S. E. the middle and
latter part fine weather land in sight
ahead Cape Saint Burke so ends these
24 hours Lat 34.12 N
Long 74.00 W

Tuesday 9

..... This day came with light winds
No 193 from the W. N. W. steering S. E. for
the land at 4 P. M. got up the
Chances and bent them at 5 kept
off S. E. for Talharana and ship
in sight steering the same cut 12.50 P. M.
kept off S. E. at 12 hauled a back till
10 morning up the port at daylight
stood in so ends these 24 hours
