April Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> 1811

No 242 This day commenced with light winds and rain squalls at 1 Bell tackled ship to the N.W. by 1 Bell the wind the middle and latter part rainy so ends these 24 hours

Monday 2<sup>nd</sup>

No 243 Ship day commences with light winds and rainy steering by the wind N.E. by E the middle and latter part light winds and rain so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup>

No 244 This day commences with light winds and fine weather steering by wind N.W. by E the wind N.E. the watch employed in putting maintop gallies on truss trees toward and struck a black fish and lost him 2 Boats the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup>

No 245 This day commenced with light winds and fine weather steering N.W. by the wind the wind N.E. by E the halpepper islands in sight the middle and latter part calm so ends these 24 hours

Thursday 5<sup>th</sup>

No 246 This day commences with calm and fine weather the middle and latter part light winds and fine weather steering N.W. so ends these 24 hours

Friday 6<sup>th</sup>

No 247 This day commenced with light winds and fine weather steering N.W. the halpeppers in sight one on our starboard bow distant 20 miles the middle and latter part light winds and fine weather steering E. by S so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 7<sup>th</sup>

No 248 This day commenced with light winds and fine weather steering E. by S the cooper employed in setting up shooks for water found a good many of them rotten and gave them to the cook to burn the latter part raised whails and got 3 so ends these 24 hours
