No 264 This day commenced with strong
winds from the S.W. steering by
the wind S.W. the middle and
latter part standing on different
tacks so ends these 24 hours

winds from the S.W. standing to
the East at sundown tacked
ship to the N.W. the middle
and latter part steering S.W.
so ends these 24 hours

No 266 This day commenced with light
winds from the S.W. at 1 P.M. tacked
ship to the S.W. at sundown hauled
on the wind to the E. at 4 P.M.
kept off S.W. at 10 saw Whales and
stood for them so ends these 24 hours

No 267 This day commenced with strong
winds from the S.W. at 1 P.M. hauled
after them the larboard boat struck
got him a long side at 2 P.M. at
4 commenced cutting finished at
7 P.M. the middle and latter part

decks so ends these 24 hours

winds from the N.E. at 2 P.M. finished
killing and washed off the decks

No 270 This day commenced with strong
winds from the S.W. standing on
different tacks the weather thick
and heavy the middle and
latter part the wind and weather
much the same so ends
