

1844 Remarks on Board

Aug Wednesday 25



S.B.

This day came with strong winds from the S.W. steering N.E. under all sail at 4 P.M. saw a school of Whales at 4 low water & boats at the Harbor boat struck got the Whail alongside at 4 P.M. and got supper at daylight commenced cutting at 4 finished so ends this day

Thursday 26

This day commenced with strong winds from the S.W. all hands employed in securing about ship at 6 P.M. tacked ship to the N.E. and started the works for baiting the middle and latter part employed in baiting heading S.E. so ends this day

Friday 27

This day commenced with light winds from the S.W. at 4 P.M. finished baiting the middle and latter part the wind strong from the N.W. standing on different tacks so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 28

This day commenced with light winds from the S.W. heading N.E. the wind S.E. the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same so ends this day

1844 Barque Cachalot of New Bedford

Aug Sunday 29

This day commenced with strong winds from the S.W. standing on different tacks at 6 P.M. spoke the Barque Clarence of N.B. 21 months out 450 sp Capt Lippard Master the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same so ends

Monday 30

day No 267

This day commenced with light winds from the S.W. standing on different tacks at sundown took in the light sails the middle and latter part the wind and weather much the same so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 31

day No 270

This day commenced with light winds from the S.W. standing on different tacks the middle and latter part the wind light from the S.W. so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday 1

This day commenced with light winds from the S.W. the match employed in mending the foresail heading N.E. one ship in sight on our bow the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same so ends this day
