1844 Tuesday 28th

This day come with light moderate winds from the NW at 1 PM tacked ship off shore the Island of Blatta in sight distant 20 Miles the middle and latter part the wind and weather much the same so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday 29th

This day come with light winds from the NW at 4 PM tacked ship to the NE one sail in sight the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same so ends

Lat 20 34 W
Long 82 20 W

Thursday 30th

This day come with light winds from the NW by steering by the wind NE one sail in sight the middle and latter part the wind strong from the NW by so ends these 24 hours

Friday 31st

This day come with strong wind from the NW one sail in sight ahead the Island of Blatta in sight distant 10 Miles of our Star beam the middle and latter part the wind light from the NW standing by the wind NW by so ends

Saturday 29th

This day come with light winds from the NW standing by the wind NW by the land in sight on our Star beam and one sail ahead the middle and latter part standing in different tacks so ends these 24 hours

Lat 20 28 00

Sunday 30th

This day come with light moderate winds from the NW by standing by the wind NW by one ship in sight on our weather beam working up the coast the middle and latter part the wind strong from the NW by standing by the wind NW by so ends these 24 hours

Monday 1st

This day come with light winds from the NW by standing by the wind NW by at 9 PM tacked ship off shore the wind light from the NW at 12 tacked in shore at daylight shaped our course for Timbuctoo so ends these 24 hours
