This day came with fine weather at 4 P.M. the boat returned on board the Capt. stepped on shore to ship two more men made sail and stood out for the night at 11 P.M. got in and sent in the boat so ends these 24 hours

Friday 30th

This day came with fine weather still laying off and on Saita at 4 P.M. the boat returned on board the Capt. on shore stood to sea for the night at daylight stood in at 10 sent in a boat for the Capt. so ends these 24 hours

Saturday 1st

This day came with light winds from the front the boat laying off and on Saita at 4 P.M. the boat returned with the Capt. and one man that he shipped as seaman by the name of George W. Ireland made sail and stood to sea by the wind which at 7 P.M. kept off so ends these 24 hours

This day came with light winds from S.W. steering N. the watch employed in boiling black fish oil at 6 P.M. hauled on the wind to the S.W. and hauled aback for the night at daylight kept off N. the wind S.W. so ends

Monday 3rd

This day came with light winds from S.W. steering N.E. & S. one sail in sight steering E. & S. at sundown luffed to the wind with the main topsail aback at daylight kept off N.W. so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday 4th

This day came with strong winds from S.W. steering N.W. at 4 P.M. saw a lot of square timber a drift at 6 P.M. hauled on the wind to the E. and shortened sail for the night at daylight kept off N.W. the watch employed in painting ship inside so ends these 24 hours
