

1846 Remarks on Board
Dec

Wednesday
This day came with light winds
from N.E. steering N.E. at sundown
hailed on the wind and lay with
the head yards aback for the night
heaving N.E. at daylight kept up
at the wind N.E. so ends this day

Thursday
This day came with strong winds
from the N.E. steering N at 4 P.M.
saw a sail on our starboard
bow at 6 hauled aback and
the ship run down. and spoke
us found it to be the barque
Susan of N Bedford the capt
came on board of us the middle
and latter part standing on
different tacks so ends

Long 87° 47' W

Friday
This day came with strong winds
from S.E. standing on different
tacks under short sail at sundown
put two reefed reefs in the
topsails the middle and latter
part standing on different
tacks so ends these 24 hours

Barque Sea Noire

Saturday
This day came with strong winds
from the S.E. at 1 P.M. bore ship to
the S.E. steering E.S.E. at sundown
hailed aback by the wind heading
E with the courses hauled up
for the night at daylight kept
up at the wind light from the S.W.
so ends these 24 hours

Lat 22° 15' N
Long 87° 38' W

Sunday
This day came with light winds
from the S.W. steering N at 4 P.M.
had a little rain at sundown
hauled up the foresail and
mainsail and took in the light
sails and luffed by the wind
N.E. at daylight kept up N.E. at
9 P.M. saw a shoal of sperm
whales toward after them and
returned on board without success
so ends these 24 hours
