

Saturday ^{the} 14th
 This day came with light winds
 from the S.E. standing to by the
 wind & one sail in sight on our
 sea g quarter at 3 o'clock saw a shoal
 of sperm whales toward the boats
 and the M.B. struck got the whale
 along side at 11 o'clock the other boats
 still in chase of the whales
 so ends these 24 hours



Saturday ^{the} 15th
 This day came with strong winds
 from the S.E. at 4 o'clock the boats
 gave up the chase and returned
 to the ship without success
 at 4 o'clock one at 6 finished
 cutting and made sail standing
 by the wind & at daylight tacked
 ship to the N.W. at 6 o'clock commenced
 boiling so ends these 24 hours

Sunday ^{the} 16th
 This day came with strong winds
 from the S.E. the middle and
 latter part the wind and weather
 much the same so ends

Sunday ^{the} 17th
 This day came with light winds
 from the S.E. at 1 o'clock tacked ship
 to the S. by the wind still employed
 in boiling oil at 10 o'clock finished
 the middle and latter part standing
 on different tacks so ends this day

Tuesday ^{the} 18th
 This day came with light winds
 from the S.E. at 1 o'clock kept off
 M.B. at 2 o'clock saw whales
 at 3 o'clock toward the boats after them
 at sundown the boats returned
 to the ship without success
 the whales going off by hauled
 down the main tack standing
 by the wind S.W. under short all
 sail at 11 o'clock saw the barque
 Cachalot on our lee bow standing
 by the wind to the eastward

Wednesday ^{the} 19th
 This day came with strong winds
 from the S.E. at 4 o'clock spoke the
 barque Cachalot with 90 barrels
 since left Port the latter part
 standing to the westward at 6 o'clock
 kept off M.B. so ends this day
