This day came with light winds from the S.W. at 1 P.M. where ship to the E.S.E. at sundown hauled by the wind to the Eastward with the courses hauled up at daylight made all sail kept off Wane sail in sight and our weather beam no ends these 24 hours

Friday ^{the} 21

This day came with light winds from the S.W. at 1 P.M. hauled by the wind E.S.E. at sundown took in the fore top gallin sail and mainsail for the night at daylight made all sail kept off Wane sail so ends these 24 hours

Saturday ^{the} 22

This day came with strong winds from the S.W. at 1 P.M. spoke the barque Cachalot and the Capt. came on board at daylight kept off Wane sail the latter part the winds strong from the S.W. so ends this day

Sunday ^{the} 23

This day came with strong winds from the S.W. steering N.W. at sundown took in the foresail and main sail and hauled by the wind for one sail in sight on our Starboard bow at daylight made all sail steering N.W. so ends this day

Monday ^{the} 24

This day came with light winds from the S.W. at 1 P.M. kept off Wane sail for W. hauled Gilead at sundown took in the light sails and hauled up the courses and luffed by the wind N.W. at 4 P.M. kept off Wane sail at 9 saw hoods Island bearing N.W. so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday ^{the} 25

This day came with light winds from the S.W. 6 sail in sight and hoods Island bearing N.W. distant 14 miles at 1 P.M. spoke the barque Joshua Bragdon and the barque Clarice the Capt. went on board at 10 returned the middle and latter part standing by the wind S.W. 9 sail in sight so ends these 24 hours
