Wednesday ^{the} 26

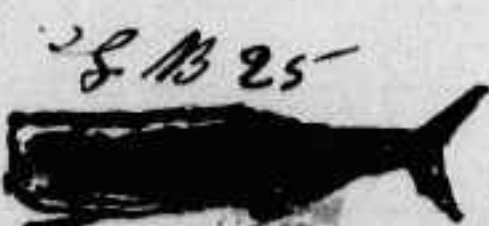
This day came with light winds from the S.S.B at 1 PM tacked ship to the E by S hoods Island in sight bearing S by E distant 15 miles the middle and latter part standing on different tacks 3 sail in sight so ends this day

Thursday ^{the} 27

This day came with light winds and fine weather the watch employed in Sunday Gibbs the cooler employed in cutting down Sides for oil at sundown Charles Island in sight distant 20 miles bearing N by W and 2 sail in sight standing by the wind for the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same steering on so ends this day

Friday ^{the} 28

This day came with light winds from the S.S.B standing by the wind for at sundown hoods Island bearing E by S distant 20 miles Charles Island bearing N by E distant 30 miles at 7 AM saw a shoal of Whales on our bow at half past 7 toward end the Bow Boat struck at 9 took the Whales on long side the other 2 boats in chase of the Whales so ends these 24 hours

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Saturday ^{the} 29

This day came with light winds and fine weather at 2 PM the other boats returned on board without success at 3 PM hooked on at half past 4 finished cutting made sail stood by the wind E by S Charles Island in sight distant 24 miles bearing N by E at 6 AM started the works the latter part standing by the wind N.W.M. so ends these 24 hours

Sunday ^{the} 30

This day came with light winds from the S.S.B standing by the wind on different tacks at 4 PM spoke the Joshua Bragden and had a game at 5 finished boiling at 10 the Capt returned on board at 8 AM kept off for hoods Island the Island distant 20 miles so ends this day

Monday ^{the} 31

This day came with light winds from the S.S.B at sundown hauled by the wind N.W by S Charles Island bearing S.W distant 15 miles and sail in sight the middle part standing by the wind for the latter part kept off N.W.M 2 sail in sight so ends these 24 hours
