Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>

This day came with fine weather and light winds from the S.E. at 4 P.M. got the whales along side at 4 hooked on and ran up to the leeward of Tower Island at 6 got one of them in and lugged to the wind with two whales along side Tower Island distant 10 miles bearing S.W. at daylight hooked on at 10 P.M. finished cutting heading E so ends these 24 hours

Monday 14<sup>th</sup>

This day came with fine weather all hand employed in clearing away the heads at 4 P.M. got the decks cleared up and started the works steering by the wind & at 6 took in the main top Gallen sail and the mainsail the wind fresh from the S.E. at 4 P.M. hauled ship to the S.W. the watch employed in boiling oil so ends this day

Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>

This day came with strong winds from the S.E. standing by the wind S.W. at 2 P.M. saw a shoal of whales on our weather beam distant 4 miles at 4 P.M. came up with them lowered and the barbed and waist boat struck got them a long rig at 6 P.M. and got supper and still boiling heading E at 7 P.M. commenced cutting at 10 P.M. finished all hands employed in clearing away the heads so ends these 24 hours
