 in sail to close reefed topsails

Monday ^{to} 5

This day come with strong
 winds from the N.W. at 2 Bell
 set double reefed topsails
 steering a course S.E. by E the
 middle and latter part running
 under single reefed topsails
 so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday ^{to} 6

This day comes with strong wind
 from the N.W. steering a course
 S.E. by E at 4 Bell the weather thick and
 squally took in the topgallingsail
 the ship now under single reefed
 topsails and courses the middle and
 latter part the wind and weather
 the same so ends

Wednesday ^{to} 7

This day come with strong
 winds from the N.W. steering
 a course S.E. by E the weather thick
 and squally at 4 Bell took in the
 main sail the middle and latter part
 the wind and weather much the
 same so ends these 24 hours

Thursday ^{to} 8

This day come with the
 wind more moderate steering
 a course S the wind N.W. at
 1 Bell saw a large ship steering
 S.E. by the wind the middle and
 latter part the wind moderate from
 the N.W. steering a course S
 under all sail so ends this day

Friday ^{to} 9

This day come with fine weather
 the wind light from the N.W.
 at 2 Bell passed the ship Richard
 Mitchel and the ship Constitution
 of Massachusetts at 4 Bell we set
 the fore-top mast standing sail
 the middle part the wind hauled
 to the N.W. it blowing strong
 took in the light sails
 the latter part much the same
 so ends this day
