This day came with a heavy
gale from the E. blowing by the
wind E.N.E. the weather thick and
rainy the middle part the
wind more moderate at 5
o'clock set the fore-sail and
last reefed fore-top-sail
so ends this day

This day came with strong
winds from the S.W. steering
a course E.N.E. under short sail
the middle part the ship under
double reefed top sails the
latter part carried away the
jib-bow stay the latter part
the wind and weather the
same so ends this day

weather much the same so ends

the wind N.E. at 4 P.M. saw two
sails steering W. the middle
part the wind and weather the
