Wednesdayth 21
This day came with strong
winds from the N.E. standing
by the wind E.S.E. at 4 Bell double
reefed the topsails and took
in the gibe the wind blowing
strong and a heavy head sea
running the middle and latter
part of the same so ends this day

Long 38.20° W

Thursdayth 22

This day came with strong
winds from the N.E. standing
by the wind E the wind is inclined
to be against us at 2 Bell
washed off the head sail
the ship making very bad
weather the sea running heavy
the ship under short sail
the middle and latter part
the wind better moderate with
some rain squalls so ends
this day

1846 May Barque Sea Breeze

Fridayth 23

This day came with light
winds from the N.E. steering
a course E by N at 4 Bell the
wind hauled to the E by N
and the weather and raining
plenty of thunder and lightning
the ship under short sail
the middle and latter part strong
winds from the N.E. steering
by the wind E so ends this day

Lat 26.21° S

Long 38.11° W

Saturdayth 24

This day came with strong
winds from the N.E. standing
by the wind E the watch
employed in filling water to
get the ship down by the stern
the middle part the weather
thick and squally at 2 Bell
tacked ship to the E.S.E. so ends
these 24 hours
