

November 1859 Wednesday 5th
 This day comes with strong trades and
 rain squalls laying off and on the Island
 the ship William Eliza* laying on the reef
 and the ships Company on the beach
 the ship had 450 barrels of oil on board at
 the time she went on she was last getting
 under way saved every thing belonging to
 the ship at sundown kept away till
 the middle and latter part strong S.E. trades
 so ends these 24 hours
 * William and Eliza sailed 1856
 Lat 14 56 S Long 119 45 W

Thursday 6th
 This day comes with strong S.E. trades NW
 the Mat employed reeve's Sails about ship
 at 4:30 Bell saw Chicocoba Island bearing S.E. distant
 30 miles at 8 in the evening tacked ship to the SW
 and shortened sail for the night at daylight stood
 in for the land it bearing from S.E. to South
 at dawn the ship 18 miles from the Island of Kein
 running the reef down to the Westward so ends this day

Friday 7th
 This day comes with light S.E. trades running
 the reef down at sundown Round Island distant
 30 miles bearing NW the middle part laying
 up back at daylight stood on our course so ends
 this day

Saturday 8th
 This day comes with light S.E. winds steering
 NW by W Round Island in sight distant 40 miles
 bearing S by W the middle part light airs from
 S.E. steering NW by W at daylight hauled by the
 wind hauled the wind light from the S.E. by E
 and rain squalls at 8 AM saw the South end
 of the Feejee Islands S.E. distant 25 miles
 sent down the main top Gallant sail to
 repair so end this day

Nov 1859 Sunday 13

This day comes with strong winds from
 the S.E. by S standing by the wind to the Southward
 at 2 Bell bent the Main top Gallant sail at 6 PM
 it blowing strong from the S.E. standing
 by the wind S by W exact one reef in the
 fore top sail the middle and latter part it blowing
 fresh from the S.E. standing by the wind S.W.
 so ends these 24 hours
 Lat 14 42 S Long 119 49 E

Monday 14th
 This day comes with strong winds from the
 S.E. standing by the wind SW the ship under
 double reef topsails with a heavy sea running
 the middle part steering a course S by W of the
 wind S.E. by E the latter part strong winds from the
 S.E. by S standing by the wind S.W. the ship under
 double reef topsails so ends this day
 Lat 20 04 S
 Long 119 06 E

Tuesday 15th
 This day comes with strong winds
 from the S.E. by S standing by the wind S.W.
 under double reef topsails at 8 Bell saw a school
 of Whales going E.S.E. 2 miles off on our weather
 bow tacked ship to the E.S.E. at dark came up
 with the Whales saw them along side of the ship
 the weather thick and a heavy sea running
 the middle part standing the E.S.E. at daylight
 tacked ship to the S by W the latter part
 strong winds from the S.E. by E so ends this day
