This day comes with fresh breezes from the South East standing by the wind on different tacks at sundown the ship heading E by S with 10 men on the main topsail yard repairing the topsail the topsail on the cap the middle and latter part standing on different tacks the wind light from the SE so ends this day

Friday 25th
This day comes with light winds from the SE standing by the wind on different tacks the watch employed in different ~~tacks~~ jobs about ship the middle part light winds from the E by S steering course SE at 6 in the morning sent down the main topsail to repair so ends this day

Saturday 26th
This day comes with light airs from the E standing by the wind SE by S at 1 P.M. bent the main topsails the middle and latter part light winds from the ESE steering SE by E so ends these 24 hours

Sunday 27th
This day comes with light airs from the E standing by the wind SE the watch employed in mending fore topmast staysail the middle and latter part light from the ESE standing by the wind to the Sward and Eward so ends this day.

This day comes with light winds from the SE standing by the wind SE the middle and latter part the wind from the E steering a course SE so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday 29th
This day comes with strong winds from the E steering a course SE at 3 P.M. took in the top gallant sails the middle and latter part strong winds from the E by E steering a course SE by E so ends this day

This day comes with strong winds from the ESE steering a course SE by E at sundown took in sail for the night set boats crew watches at 8 A.M. sent down the fore topsail to repair so ends this day

Thursday 1 December
This day comes with strong winds from the ESE steering course SE the ship under double main topsail at sundown took in the foresail and set the boat on the upper canvas the weather thick and bluster the middle and latter part the weather thick and rainy the wind blowing strong from the WSW steering ESE so ends these 24 hours

Friday 2nd
This day comes with strong winds from the WSW steering a course E by S the ship under double reefed topsails with the mainsail furled the watch employed in sundre jobs about ship the middle part steering E the wind moderate at daylight sent down the mainsail to repair so ends this day
Lat 31.40 Long 175.00

Saturday 3rd
This day comes with moderate winds from the W by S steering a course ESE at 3 P.M. bent the mainsail at sundown the took in the light sails and double reefed the fore topsail the middle and latter part fine weather steering E by E the wind SW so ends
