

Sea Breeze New Bedford

Monday 12th

This day Comes with a fine breeze from the NW standing by the wind WNW Sunday Island in sight bearing N by E half S distant 25 miles and sail in sight standing by the wind on the same tack the middle and latter part the wind and weather the same sundown took in the light sails and furled the Mainsail heading by the wind S by E so ends there 24 hours Macaulys Island in sight bearing WNW distant 25 miles so ends

Tuesday 13th

This day Comes with light winds from the WNW standing by the wind S by E Macaulys Island in sight distant 18 miles bearing N and sail in sight standing on the same tack the middle and latter part standing by the wind S by W so ends this day

Wednesday 14th

This day Comes with light winds from the W steering SSW the weather squally thick and raw and then a rain squall at 6 PM backed ship to the S by E the wind backed to the SE at sundown took in the light sails and furled the Mainsail and double reefed the fore and the foretop sail the middle and latter part steering S by E at 9 AM saw French Rock bearing SSE distant 15 miles so ends this day

Thursday 15th

This day Comes with light winds from the SW steering a course SSW at sundown shortened sail to double reef topsails and hauled by the wind WSW at 9 o'clock at night backed ship to the WSW the weather thick and rainy at 4 AM took in the fore topsails and mainsail it blowing a moderate gale from the WSW so ends this day

Friday 16th

This day Comes with a moderate gale from WSW laging by the wind heading S under close reefed Main topsail at daylight the wind light from the W steering SEW made all sail saw French Rock bearing N by E distant 25 miles so ends this day

Saturday 17th

This day Comes with fine weather and light winds from the SSW steering S by W at 8 PM saw Macaulys and the larkies bearing SSE at sundown took in the light sails for the night the middle and latter part light air from the SE steering a course SSE at 11 AM the ship 10 miles from Macaulys Island so ends these 24 hours

Sunday 18th

This day Comes with strong winds from the SE steering a course SSE at sundown Sunday Island in sight distant 35 miles bearing SSE hauled the ship by the wind SSE and took in the light sails and hauled by up the courses and double reefed the topsails at 8 in the evening hauled by the wind and laged a back till daylight and kept off Cape Cod at 2 AM the Capt went on shore the ship laging off and on so ends this day

Monday 19th

This day Comes with strong winds from the SE still laging off and on the Island at 2 PM the Capt returned on board brought off some cabbage and a few ducks and fowls braced full standing by the wind SSW at 6 kept off SSW the middle part steering a course SSW half W at daylight made all sail standing by the wind N by E the SSW so ends
