

40 Remarks on board Monday November 24. 1834

this 24 hours commences with light S.E. trade winds & pleasant weather under all sail standing to the S.W. one sail in sight standing to the S.W. latter part of the day fair weather under all sail watch employed in ships duty lat in by obl 48 miles South long by Dr 26. 30 W long by Chr 27. 20

41 Remarks on board Tuesday November 25. 1834

this day commences with light S.E. trade winds & pleasant weather under all sail steering to the S.W. watch employed in ships duty middle & latter part of the day strong breeze & ruff at 9 A.M. lowered after black fish & got nothing at 10 came on board & steered to the S.W. lat in by obl 3. 00 South long in by Dr 27. 50 W

42 Remarks on board Wednesday November 26. 1834

this 24 hours commences with strong S.E. trades & passing clouds under all necessary sail steering S.W. variation W at 1 P.M. fired four top. galant sail & reeled in 112 top sail latter part of the day more moderate weather lat by obl 5. 50 South long in by Chron 28. 50 W long by Dr 28. 30 West

43 Remarks on board Thursday November 27. 1834

this 24 hours begins with strong trades steering S.S.W. at 5 P.M. part of brig standing to the S.W. & under all sail latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds at 9 A.M. saw a school of sperm whales lowered 3 boats & chased till 3, 0. lock in the afternoon & got nothing come on board & steered to the Southward lat by Dr 8. 10 S long by Dr 29. 18 W

44 Remarks on board Friday November 28. 1834

this 24 hours commences with fine trade winds & passing clouds hauling wharves at 8 P.M. came on board with nothing & steered to the Southward latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather under all sail steering S.W. compass lat in by obl 10. 23 S long in by Dr 30. 00 West

45 Remarks on board Saturday November 29. 1834

this 24 hours begins with light trades & pleasant weather all hands employed in ships duty middle & latter part of the day light breeze & pleasant weather set four top mast steering sail & main top galant steering sail wind from the East lat by obl 12. 30 S long by Dr 31. 19 W

46 Remarks on board Sunday November 30. 1834

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the East & pleasant weather all hands employed in ships duty set lower steering sail steering S.W. latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds one sail in sight standing to the East lat by obl 14. 31 S long by Dr 31. 50 W

47 Remarks on board Monday December 1. 1834

this 24 hours commences with a fine breeze from the East & passing clouds under all sail steering S.W. middle & latter part of the day light winds from the East & passing clouds watch employed in ships duty lat in by obl 17. 00 long by Dr 32. 20

48 Remarks on board Tuesday December 2. 1834

this day commences with light winds from the East & passing clouds under all sail steering S.W. all hands employed in ships duty on land the old sparke & bent the new one latter part light winds from the South & cloudy weather by spells shifted the steering sails on the starboard side lat in by obl 19. 10 South long in by Dr 32. 55 West
