

Remarks on board Thursday December 11. 1834

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from S E & passing clear at 1 P M sent down main Royal yard & mast at 4 P M got at distance between the sun & moon
latter part of the day light winds from the S E Westward & pleasant weather left in by alt 34. 36 South Long in by Dr 43. 40 West

Remarks on board Friday December 12. 1834

this 24 hours commences with light winds from the S E by S & pleasant weather watch employed in ship's duty at 3 P M lowered the boat & caught one porpoise & mackerel latter part of the day light winds & calm watch employed in rigging in the foremast at 11 P M saw a large sperm whale lowered & boats calm weather left by alt 34. 45 S Long in by Dr 44. 10 West

Remarks on board Saturday December 13. 1834

this 24 hours commences with a light breeze from the S E Eastward & pleasant weather at 2 P M the Larboard boat got lost to the whale & killed him at 4 P M got him at long side & got ready for cutting him in & set the watch we had at men to fall from the left & hurt himself never back with & latter part of the day light winds from the S E Eastward fine weather at 4 P M called all hands & commenced cutting the whale at 2 P M got 1 M saw a large sperm whale lowered & got fast to the Larboard boat & commenced cutting our whale in part 10 A M came on board & commenced cutting our whale left by alt 34. 30 South Long in by Dr 43. 50 West

Remarks on board Sunday December 14. 1834

this 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the S E Eastward & fine weather at 8 P M finished cutting in our whale & set the watch at 9 P M kept off by 1/2 watch employed in cutting junk at 4 P M commenced boiling our whale one watch employed left by alt 35. 30 Long by Dr 44. 30 West

Remarks on board Monday December 15. 1834

this 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the S E Eastward & rugged steering S E by E on watch employed in boiling blubber at 2 P M saw the brig Merry of Philadelphia standing to the S E Eastward at 9 P M finished boiling head & commenced boiling body at 10 finished the Muzz & Tappail
latter part of the day squally & rugged & rainy weather at 4 P M worked down the works at 9 finished down sail & four Tappail at 11 lay to & lost reefed main Tappail & spanker left by Dr 30. 25 South Long in by Dr 44. 00 West

Remarks on board Tuesday December 16. 1834

this 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the S E Westward & a large sea on at 2 P M gave up ship & headed to the S E by S & commenced boiling at 12 at night clear weather & a strong breeze from the W by N at 2 A M took in fore & main Tappail at 6 set them at 8 set main Tappail & Mizzen Tappail pleasant weather left by alt 30. 50 Dr 44. 41 West

Remarks on board Wednesday December 17. 1834

this 24 hours commences with a fine breeze from the S E Westward & pleasant weather at 1 P M finished boiling out our whale & washed off decks at 2 P M took in fore & main Tappail & washed off decks at 4 finished washing decks & lost reefed four Tappail & double reefed Main & Mizzen at 5 P M took in the Bow Boat & put her on the try works & took the waist Boat up to the davit head at 7 P M lost reefed main Tappail fresh gales from the S E & large sea on steering S by W at 10 P M set the four Tappails & lost reef spanker latter part fresh gales & rugged at 2 A M took in four Tappail at 7 set it again left by alt 39. 43 South Long by Chronometer 44. 40
