

Remarks on board Thursday December 18. 1834.

these 24 hours commenced with fresh breeze from the N by E & ruff weather at 2 past 12 saw a large sperm whale going quick to the windward at 1 let one reef out of main topsail at 2 P.M. set single reef four main & Mizzen topsails & jib at 3 P.M. double reefed four main topsail at 4 P.M. furled jib & mainsail at 10 furled four & Mizzen topsails at 11 furled four sail & lost reefed main topsail & lay to by the wind at 12 at night the eye felt that convinced the main stay broke to the heel of the bow sprits got 3 luff tackles & set it up again latter part fresh gale & rugged at 9 A.M. raised too dead by one in the stay & one in a strap & set the stay up with a lanyard

Remarks on board Friday December 19. 1834

these 24 hours commenced with fresh gale from the S.W. & large sea on at 2 P.M. set the four sails at 5 P.M. set close reef Mizzen & Boreail middle part of the day more moderate weather at 11 P.M. set double reef four topsail latter part moderate winds from W. & S.W. & few rain squalls by spells at 2 turned one reef out of the main topsail at 5 A.M. set main course & jib at 4 past 7 at 11 commenced stowing down our oil in the lower hold Lat in by D^r 41.50 South Long in by D^r 45.00 West

Remarks on board Saturday December 20. 1834

these 24 hours commenced with a fine breeze from the S.W. & at 3 P.M. rain squalls by spells at 4 P.M. finished stowing down our oil & washed off decks we stowed down 70 barrels
latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather under all sail stowing of S.W. water employed in ships duty Lat in by D^r 43.17 South Long in by D^r 45.20 West

Remarks on board Sunday December 21. 1834

these 24 hours commenced with light winds from the westward & a large sea heaving from the southward at 4 P.M. wind halled to the Northward all hands employed in fitting the main stay & setting it up & set up main topsail stay & top galant stay at 9 P.M. furled main & four topsails at 1 A.M. set it again
latter part of the day strong winds thick rainy weather at 10 A.M. took in 3 topsails at noon reefed the topsails

Remarks on board Monday December 22. 1834

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.W. & thick & rainy weather at 3 P.M. set main top galant sail at 8 P.M. tacked ship to the N.W. & at 11 P.M. wind halled to the S.E. steamer S.W. & S. latter part of the day fine breeze from the Eastward clearing weather watch employed in stowing the deck & scum in the lower hold
Lat in by D^r 46.40 South Long in by D^r 48.10 West

Remarks on board Tuesday December 23. 1834

these 24 hours commenced with a fine breeze from the S.E. & cloudy weather under all sail stowing of S.W. & watch employed in ships duty at 4 P.M. took in the lower hold & put her over board at 6 wind halled to the South took in four topsails stowing sail at 8 past 11 P.M. tacked ship to the S.E. & Eastward latter part of the day strong winds from S.W. & squally weather at 2 A.M. furled four & Mizzen top galant sails at 5 furled main top sail at 7 double reefed topsails at 9 furled jib & main sail at 10 furled four & Mizzen topsail at 11 lost reefed main topsail & lay to by the wind
Lat in by D^r 47.26 South Long in by D^r 49.00 West

Remarks on board Wednesday December 24. 1834

these 24 hours begins with fresh gale from the S.W. & squally weather laying too heading to the S.E. & Eastward at 10 P.M. set close reef four & Mizzen topsail latter part of the day squally weather & plenty of rain at 10 A.M. reefed main sail & set it
Lat in by D^r 48.20 South Long in by D^r 49.15 West

Remarks on board Thursday December 25. 1834

these 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the S.W. & weather at 1 P.M. turned one reef out of the four & main topsails at 2 P.M. got up two cask of water & stowed them in the first at 6 wind died away calm & a large swell heaving from the South latter part of the day moderate weather at 4 A.M. turned one reef out four main topsail & out of the main sail at 10 A.M. turned the reef out of the main topsail & set main top galant sail
