

122 Remarks on board Saturday February 14. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & pleasant weather under all sail steering NW in sight of the land at sunset hauled top gal sails & hauled to the westward at 5 PM made all sail & steered NW with a fine breeze we were bound off on the western ground watch employed in ships duty  
Left in by 14.21 South

123 Remarks on board Sunday February 15. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & passing clouds under all sail steering NW watch employed in ships duty at sunset hauled top gal sails at 5 PM made all sail & killed the old boat fine breeze & passing clouds  
Left in by 13.00 South

124 Remarks on board Monday February 16. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & passing clouds under all sail steering NW by compass saw a school of black fish at sunset hauled top gal sails at 5 PM made all sail latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds saw a large school of small deer squid left in by 12.10 South

125 Remarks on board Tuesday February 17. 1835

this day commences with a fine SE trade breeze under all sail steering NW employed in ships duty at sunset hauled top gal sails latter part of the day fine breeze & flying clouds under all sail left in by 10.55 South

126 Remarks on board Wednesday February 18. 1835

this day begins with a fine trade breeze & squalls of rain employed in fitting the rigging at 6 PM hauled main top gal sail & miter top sail rainy weather at 5 PM made all necessary fine breeze & pleasant weather employed in rattling down the rigging left in by 10.05 South

127 Remarks on board Thursday February 19. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze under all sail steering NW employed in rattling down the rigging at 2 PM saw a school of sperm whales lowered 8 boats & the waist boat got fast & drewed the iron chaind them til sunset came on board & took in sail & lay under double reef main topsail & foresail at 12 at night kept off NW at 5 PM made all necessary sail strong breeze at 8 PM hauled to the SE  
Left in by 9.39 South

128 Remarks on board Friday February 20. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a strong SE trade at 1 PM saw a whale & called it a sperm whale lowered 2 boats & found him to be a fin back at sunset shortened sail & wore ship & hauled to the SE & westward at 5 PM called all hands & made all necessary sail fine breeze & cloudy weather at sunrise saw a school of large sperm whales got breakfast & lowered after them & got one to the bow boat & took him a long side & commenced cutting him in at 10 o'clock  
Left in by 9.45 South long in by 8.00

129 Remarks on board Saturday February 21. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a light breeze & pleasant weather all hands employed in cutting in our whale at 5 o'clock finished cutting in at 6 PM finished cutting junk & got supper at 7 set the watch & commenced boiling latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather saw a plenty of black fish  
Left in by 9.25 South

130 Remarks on board Sunday February 22. 1835

this 24 hours begins with pleasant weather & a fine breeze under all sail boiling our whale saw a plenty of black fish at sunset shortened sail & set the watch latter part of the day fine weather at 10 at night finished boiling at 5 PM called all hands & made all sail & worked the decks broke out the fore hold after a cask of water left in by 8.35 South long in by 8.30
