this 24 hour begins with fine weather & thousands of black fish in sight at sunset shortened sail & headed to the S & westward latter part of the day fine weather at 4 PM called all hands & commenced breaking out the lower hold to stow down the oil nothing in sight remarkable latter in by oblf 8.41 South

132 Remarks on board Tuesday February 24. 1835

this 24 hour commences with a fine breeze & fine weather all hands employed in stowing down oil at sunset hauled fish & shanked & lay with the main yard aback at 4 PM called all hands & made all necessary sail & commenced starting oil in the ground two cask fine weather latter in by oblf 8.32 South

133 Remarks on board Wednesday February 25. 1835

this 24 hour begins with fine weather all hands employed in stowing of the hold at 4 PM finished stowing & washed off Decks at sunset shortened sail & steered to the middle & latter part of the day fine weather under all sail steering S by S
latter in by oblf 9.04 South

134 Remarks on board Thursday February 26. 1835

this 24 hour begins with fine weather under all sail steering S by S all hands employed in washing down at sunset shortened sail & steered to the S & westward latter part of the day fine weather employed in fitting the rigging latter in by oblf 9.40 South

135 Remarks on board Friday February 27. 1835

this 24 hour commences with a fine breeze & fine weather under all necessary sail watch employed in rattling down the rigging at 1 PM kept off even at sunset shortened sail middle & latter part of the day fine weather & pleasant weather employed in fitting the rigging saw a plenty of black fish
latter in by oblf 8.11 South

136 Remarks on board Saturday February 28. 1835

this 24 hour begins with light breeze & pleasant weather watch employed in rattling the rigging at 2 PM saw a brig standing to the S & westward at sunset hauled main top gal & trail middle & latter part of the day fine pleasant weather watch employed in ship's duty latter in by oblf 7.22 South

137 Remarks on board Sunday March 1. 1835

this day commences with light breeze & pleasant weather watch employed in rattling down the main rigging nothing in sight remarkable at sunset hauled main top gal sail & main topmast steering sail steering S by S latter part of the day cloudy weather & small rain latter in by oblf 4.34 South

138 Remarks on board Monday March 2. 1835

this day begins with cloudy weather & a plenty of small rain at 6 PM reefed topsails latter part of the day fine weather employed in ship's duty latter in by oblf 5.26 South

139 Remarks on board Tuesday March 3. 1835

this 24 hour begins with cloudy weather & some small rain under all necessary sail at 6 PM hauled top gal sails steering S by S latter part of the day light breeze & pleasant weather & very warm weather watch employed in rearing the mizen rigging & other work of various kinds latter in by oblf 4.52 South

140 Remarks on board Wednesday March 4. 1835

this day commences with warm & pleasant weather watch employed in ship's duty at sunset hauled top gal sails & reefed the four & mizen topmast steering S by S middle & latter part of the day light winds & calm employed in ship's duty
latter in by oblf 4.34 South
