145 Remarks on board Monday March 9. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a light breeze & pleasant weather
at sunset pulled top gal sails calm went in & swimming
at 7 P.M. called all hands & washed off decks at sunrise saw a
school of large sperm whales calm binned 3 boats & got one to the
starboard bow took him a long side & two boats seized the school but
did not get part at 12 came on board & got dinner & commenced cutting
Latt in by 4.40 South

146 Remarks on board Tuesday March 10. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze all hands employed in cutting in our
whale saw a number of whales breaching & spouting at 8 P.M. finished cutting
& set the width at 10 commenced breaching the head fine weather middle &
latter part of the day light breeze & pleasant weather steering
S.W. breaching our whale nothing in sight remark all
Latt in by 4.17 South

147 Remarks on board Wednesday March 11. 1835

this 24 hours begins with light breeze & pleasant weather
steering S.W. at 6 P.M. finished breaching out our blubber &
hoiled off the oil in the cask & stood short watches at 5 P.M.
all hands & washed off decks fine breeze & fine weather
employed in ship's duty Latt in by 4.50 South

148 Remarks on board Thursday March 12. 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather employed
in ship's duty at 4 P.M. saw two ships heave off for them at 8 P.M.
Spoke the ship Champion of Bagatton capt. West 14 1/2 months out
700 lb the hero of nantucket 18 1/2 months out 1000 lb latter
part of the day fine weather under all sail watch employed
in ship's duty Latt in by 4.25 South

149 Remarks on board Friday March 13. 1835

all hands employed in working them close at sunset pulled top
gal sails latter part of the day light breeze & cloudy
weather at 11 P.M. commenced raining Latt in by 4.30 South
