

150 Remarks on board Sunday March 15 1835

this 24 hours begins with light breeze & rainy weather at half past 1 PM cleared off pleasant weather watch employed in ships duty at sunset furl'd top gal sails latter part of the day light breeze & calm & pleasant weather left in by 2.50 South

151 Remarks on board Monday March 16 1835

this day commences with light breeze from the S. westward saw two fin backs at sunset furl'd top gal sails latter part of the day light breeze at 5 PM called all hands & made all sail & washed off decks & commenced painting the ship at 11 PM saw a large school of sperm whales & breaching got dinner & lowered for them left in by 2.40 South

152 Remarks on board Tuesday March 17 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & pleasant weather chasing whales at 1 PM got fast to the larboard boat & the rest cleared for life took the whale & long, side & hump off for the whales but could not get up with them at 4 PM commenced cutting our whale killed at 8 PM & dropped her at sunset finished cutting our whale wore ship to the N. westward & set quarter watches at 5 PM called all hands & commenced cutting up the head at 7 PM began to sail at 8 PM ship to the South some squalls of rain left in by 2.50 South

153 Remarks on board Wednesday March 18 1835

this 24 hours begins with light winds & some squalls of rain killing at sunset veiled the whales squally weather at 7 PM called down the fine & plenty of rain it rained till 4 PM at 5 PM called all hands & commenced killing some small rain by shells & light winds left in by 2.34 South

154 Remarks on board Thursday March 19 1835

this 24 hours begins with light winds & hazy clouds at half past one finished killing & washed off decks steering WSW by the wind latter part of the day rainy by shells steering SSW left in by 2.48 South

155 Remarks on board Friday March 20 1835

this 24 hours begins with light winds from the S. & fine weather under all sail steering SSW at sunset furl'd top gal sails & veiled the four top sail at 5 PM made all sail & steered SSW all hands employed in washing three close left in by 3.58 South long in by corner 109.18 West

156 Remarks on board Saturday March 21 1835

this day begins with a fine breeze under all sail steering SSW all hands employed in washing three close at sunset furl'd top gal sails latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather under all sail steering WSW left in by 4.58 South long in by corner 112.14 West

157 Remarks on board Sunday March 22 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather under all sail steering SSW employed in ships duty at sunset furl'd top gal sails at 5 PM made all necessary sail some squalls of rain at 7 PM hump off at 10 PM saw a school of sperm whales lowered 8 boats after them & got fast to the bow boat & she run very fast at 11 PM the starboard boat got fast & got stern left in by 5.25 South long in by 11.30 West

158 Remarks on board Monday March 23 1835

this 24 hours begins with a strong trade breeze chasing whales at 1 PM got fast to the fast whale with the waist boat & got stern & the bow boat got stern 3 boats stern caught & rowed killed the whale took the stern boats in on the crains at 4 PM got the whale at long side & commenced cutting the whale at sunset set quarter watches the starboard waist & bow boat got stern at 5 PM called all hands & commenced cutting the whale at 7 got the head off at 11 PM finished cutting & hauled the cord left in by 5.10 South long in by 11.50 West
