this 24 hours begins with pleasant weather at 4 PM the ship being under way of New Bedford capt Baker came to anchor 11 months out 340 barrels capt Baker came on board of us latter part of the day pleasant weather at 9 AM the ship too brother of Capt Gordon capt ally & the ship Chambliss of Nantucket with men were employed in getting off weather taring the main rigging & C

180 Remarks on board Tuesday April 14. 1835

this 24 hours begins with pleasant weather employed in taring the main rigging & other various kinds of work about the ship & fanning from our ship to the other latter part of the day pleasant weather Starboard watch on liberty & the larboard watch getting off weather & C R

181 Remarks on board Wednesday April 15. 1835

this 24 hours begins with pleasant weather the larboard employed in storing water in the four hold the Starboard watch on liberty middle & latter part of the day fine pleasant weather Starboard watch got off at night of water & hauled the ship & painted the bows & C

182 Remarks on board Thursday April 16. 1835

this 24 hours begins with pleasant weather the Starboard watch employed in ship's duty the larboard watch on liberty middle & latter part of the day fine weather the larboard watch employed in painting the ship & the Starboard watch on liberty & C

183 Remarks on board Friday April 17. 1835

this 24 hours begins with pleasant weather laying to anchor in New Bedford harbor larboard watch employed in painting the ship the Starboard watch on liberty latter part of the day some showers of rain by shells Starboard watch employed in painting the ship by shells & the larboard watch at shore on liberty to end this day

184 Remarks on board Saturday April 18. 1835 Saturday morning

this 24 hours begins with some small rain by shells Starboard watch employed in painting the ship & the larboard watch on liberty latter part of the day fine weather the larboard watch employed in painting the ship & the Starboard watch on liberty

185 Remarks on board Sunday April 19. 1835

this 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in New Bedford harbor larboard watch employed in painting the ship & the Starboard watch at shore on liberty latter part of the day fine weather & pleasant larboard watch on liberty one boat went over to harbor bay after logs at 8 AM saw a ship off to the mouth of the harbor the ship commander of New Bedford capt Osborn 33 months out 1000 barrels the ship was at laying off and an capt Osborn came in & stayed all night & sent his boat back to the ship latter

186 Remarks on board Monday April 20. 1835

this 24 hours commences with pleasant weather larboard watch on liberty at 4 PM the boat came back from harbor bay with 7 logs & some baranna latter part of the day fine weather one boat went over to tip ~~logs~~ logs & C

187 Remarks on board Tuesday April 21. 1835

this day begins with fine weather larboard watch employed in getting off weather at 2 PM capt Osborn came out of the ship & stood to sea at 5 PM the boat got back from tip with 12 logs latter part of the day fine weather larboard watch on liberty ~~logs~~ logs & C
