

188 Remarks on board Wednesday April 22. 1835

the 24 hours begins with pleasant weather & at 11 AM the
larboard watch on liberty the starboard watch got off 24 vails of weather from
the shore & hoisted it in at 5 PM the larboard watch were on board & capt
Crowell put two men in irons on suspicion of running away one is
John D. Shaw & the other Eugene Calyhorn at 5 AM called all
hands & commenced heaving up our anchor & stood to sea in company
with 3 ships two of them bound to the Society Islands the william
wist & us is bound up to Shitahoo after logs & potatoes light winds
at 7 AM let our men out of irons we have 30 men all told 3
convicts & one white man were shipped in crew aboard

189 Remarks on board Thursday April 23. 1835

the 24 hours begins with light winds & pleasant weather under all
sail steering by the wind to beat up to Shitahoo in company with
the william wist capt Daget latter part of the day light winds & pleasant
weather at daylight in the morning we saw a school of sperm whales
all round the ship toward 3 boats & got nothing they were going quick
off between Hoopoor & Rohogoo we lost sight of the william wist

190 Remarks on board Friday April 24. 1835

the 24 hours begins with pleasant weather under all sail beating up
to Rohogoo at 4 PM lowered 3 boats after whales & never saw
them after we lowered at dusk were on board & took up the boats
latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather under all sail
beating up to Shitahoo so ends the day

191 Remarks on board Saturday April 25. 1835

the 24 hours begins with light winds & pleasant weather under all sail
beating up to Shitahoo watch employed in washing their clothes at 8 PM
to the ship to the larboard latter part of the day light winds & pleasant weather
at 8 AM saw a school of whales lowered 4 boats & got the one to the larboard boat
one to the larboard boat killed it & got the meat & let him go got back to
the william wist & got nothing else saw the day

192 Remarks on board Sunday April 26. 1835

the 24 hours begins with pleasant weather at 2 PM got our whales at
long side & got dinner at 3 PM commenced cutting in our whales
at 6 PM finished cutting them in got supper & with the watch Shitahoo
low east from us distance 15 miles calm weather middle & latter part
of the day fine breeze & paving clouds beating up to Shitahoo
at 6 PM commenced boiling our whales ends fine weather

193 Remarks on board Monday April 27. 1835

the 24 hours begins with fine weather employed in boiling
blubber at sunset Shitahoo low & compass over distance 5 leagues
middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 7
PM finished boiling out our whales & washed off decks
so ends the day

194 Remarks on board Tuesday April 28. 1835

the 24 hours begins with fine weather the watch employed
in cleaning out the fresh water but & other various kinds of
work saw a plenty of porpoises at sunset Shitahoo low east
from us distance 8 miles latter part of the day rainy weather
at 8 PM the natives come off to us from Shitahoo at 9
put the boat on shore laying off & on

195 Remarks on board Wednesday April 29. 1835

the 24 hours begins with light winds & calms laying off & on
at Shitahoo at 2 PM boat come on board & capt arrived went on
shore to see the missionaries at 8 PM he was on board & beat
with 4 logs & few potatoes & some ~~meat~~ to stay the night
latter part of the day fine weather at 11 PM came to
an anchor in Resolution bay Shitahoo the decks were
full of natives so ends the day
