

194 Remarks on board Thursday April 30. 1835
this 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in
Ohtahoo harbour with the decks full of women & men at 10 AM
saw a ship we were employed in getting off hoop at 11 PM the
boat came on board of us the ship hove to of New Bedford 334
months out 1450 capt post at 5 PM we had a man hit by a log
in his arm very bad dressed his wound & capt post went on board of
his ship we set short watches for the night latter part of the day
fine weather at 7 AM two of our boats went over the SE part of
the island after potatoes at 8 AM the ship came to anchor ends the
24 hours

197 Remarks on board Friday May 1. 1835
this 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor in
Ohtahoo harbour at 5 PM our boats come back from the weather
side of the island with 30 bushels of potatoes latter part of the day
fine weather at 3 AM two men run away from our ship
swimmed ashore at 8 AM two boats went after potatoes over the
SE part of the island the watch employed in ships duty to end
this day

198 Remarks on board Saturday May 2. 1835
this 24 hours begins with fine weather laying to anchor
in Ohtahoo bay at 5 PM boats come back from the weather
bay with 40 bushels of potatoes much & latter part of the day fine
weather employed in various kinds of work about the ship at 8 AM two
boats went over to some bay after coconuts to end this day all well

199 Remarks on board Sunday May 3. 1835
this day begins with fine weather laying to anchor in Ohtahoo harbour
at 10 AM the boats got back with the coconuts & we hove to with
the hove to in the evening latter part of the day fine weather
laying to anchor in Ohtahoo at 10 AM the missionaries had
a meeting on board of the Fluorite capt post 1 was

200 Remarks on board Monday May 4. 1835
this day begins fine weather at 8 PM weighed our anchors &
stood to sea with 30 bows on board & at five bells under
easing sail steering SW by W with short hove watches much &
latter part of the day pleasant weather & light breeze steering
for New Haven harbour ends fine weather

201 Remarks on board Tuesday May 5. 1835
this day commences with light breeze & pleasant weather at 5 PM
stood in abreast of New Haven harbour & the pilot came on board
his party was short we kept off SW by W under all sail at 7 PM
putted four & five on top of sails & steered South at 11 tacked ship
& stood over bow New Haven latter part of the day calm
& pleasant weather between vapor & crew harmon

202 Remarks on board Wednesday May 6. 1835
this 24 hours commences with light breeze & pleasant weather
steering South off the west side of New Haven at 4 PM wind
blew us off West watch employed in various kinds of work
latter part of the day light breeze & pleasant weather steering
to the SE & Eastward under all murepany sail watch employed in
washing there close

203 Remarks on board Thursday May 7. 1835
this 24 hours begins with fine weather under all murepany sail
steering to the SE & Eastward watch employed in washing there close at
sunset Proctor bore N by W from us distance 9 leagues much
& latter part of the day fine breeze & pleasant weather steering SE by E
by the wind watch employed in picking over our potatoes no land in
sight latter part of the day 11. 23 South
