

230 Remarks on board the Ship Cadmus of Fairhaven Wednesday June 3rd 1835

this day strong breeze & cloudy weather employed in mending the stoven boat & washing down at 8 PM wore ship to the S & hauled the main sail

latter part of the day strong breeze & gully of shells at 8 AM saw a school of whales lowered 3 boats & got fast to the Starboard boat & examined the irons secured the whales but did not get fast come on board & got dinner left in by 8. 31 North

231 Remarks on Thursday June 4th 1835

this day fine weather & at plenty of whales in sight at 1 PM lowered 3 boats & chained the whales but could not get fast at 2 PM come on board of the ship the whales were going to the windward at sunset hauled the gal sail & fly jib & main sail heading to the S & westward

latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds at 8 AM saw several large breaches we took them to be sperm whales got the boats ready & followed them to a fin back so knew this day left in by 8. 25 North

232 Remarks on Friday June 5th 1835

this day fine breeze & passing clouds steering to the N & E employed in mending the stoven boat at sunset hauled main sail & main top gal sail middle & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 8 AM tacked ship to the S & W & commenced breaking out the main hatch way to store our oil some employed in mending the boat left in by 8. 30 North

233 Remarks on Saturday June 6th 1835

this day light winds & fine weather steering down oil at 1 PM finished mending the boat & put her over head on the stow at 5 finished steering down the oil

latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather steering to the S & all hands employed in washing down & c left in by 8. 4. 55 North

234 Remarks on Sunday June 7th 1835

this day fine weather & at fine breeze employed in washing down at sunset hauled main sail & main top gal sail

latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather under all murepary sail steering to the S & at 8 AM hauled the North at 11 AM saw a school of whales & breaching 12 miles off left in by 8. 4. 55 North

235 Remarks on the Western Grouper Monday June 8th 1835

this day strong breeze & passing clouds at 1 PM lowered 3 boats after whales & chained them to the windward & got fast to the Starboard & Starboard boats the lines got a foul of each other cut off the cable line & then parted the other line seized the whales but could not get fast come on board of the ship & secured for them at 4 past 5 PM lowered for them a gun could not get fast come on board of the ship & shortened sail & steered by the wind to the S & Eastward at plenty of whales in sight

latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds under all murepary sail steering to the Westward employed in ships duty left in by 8. 4. 46

236 Remarks on Tuesday June 9th 1835

this day fine breeze & passing clouds employed in ships duty at sunset shortened sail & wore ship to the S & Eastward

latter part of the day fine weather at 8 AM hauled the ship off duty & watch employed in various kinds of work left in by 8. 4. 55 North

237 Remarks on Wednesday June 10th 1835

this day fine weather steering N & E employed in mending the old boat at 3 PM saw a school of sperm whale run out lost to him at sunset hauled main top gal sail & steered by the wind to the Eastward

latter part of the day pleasant weather under all sail steering N & E employed in mending the old boat left in by 8. 5. 32 North

238 Remarks on Thursday June 11th 1835

this day pleasant weather under all sail steering N & E. mending in mending the old boat & other various kinds of work fitted our four & main royal rigging at sunset shortened sail & steered by the wind to the S & Eastward wind from the South

latter part of the day strong winds & passing clouds employed in boat building & other kind of work

left in by 8. 6. 15 North
