

312 On Board of the Ship Cordonia of Fairhaven William

Remarks on Monday, August 24, 1835

first part of the day light breeze & pleasant weather steering to the S W at sunset shortened sail some showers of rain latter part of the day light wind & a shower of rain now & then broke out the hole after noon crew with showers of rain by shells left in by 5 1/2 9.14 South

313 Remarks on Tuesday August 25, 1835

this 24 hours commenced with fine breeze & small rain by shells steering S W at sunset shortened sail & steered South rainy weather latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds employed in ships duty steering to the S W left in by 5 1/2 9.38 South

314 Remarks on Wednesday August 26, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & showers of rain by shells at 8 P M double reefed the top sails & stove holocausts steering S W middle & latter part of the day squally & rainy by shells at 6 P M turned the reef out the top sails & ran squally left in by 5 1/2 10.45 South

315 Remarks on Thursday August 27, 1835

this 24 hours begins with squally weather at 2 P M double reefed the four top sails & single reefed the main at 4 P M fished fish & mainmast rainy & squally steering to the S W by the wind at 7 P M double reefed the main top sail latter part of the day strong winds & squally by shells steering to the S W at 11 P M let the main sail left in by 5 1/2 11.30 South

316 Remarks on Friday August 28, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a strong breeze & rugged weather at 2 P M set the fish steering to the S W under all mainmast sail middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds under all mainmast sail steering to the S W west day to day left in by 5 1/2 12.27 South long in by 14.00 14.00 South

317 Remarks on Saturday August 29, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & passing clouds under all mainmast sail steering to the S W employed in washing down

latter part of the day fine breeze & pleasant weather on board the fish & mended it & fished the boards on the wind by C left in by 5 1/2 13.20 South long in by 14.15 14.15 South

318 Remarks on Sunday August 30, 1835

this day begins with fine weather steering to the S W employed in ships duty at 11 P M took ship to the S W & at 2 P M turned to the South latter part of the day fine weather under all sail steering South left in by 5 1/2 14.02 South long in by 14.50 14.50 South

319 Remarks on Monday August 31, 1835

this 24 hours begins with fine weather under all sail steering South middle part of the day thick weather & heavy rain at 3 P M wore ship to the North at 5 wore ship to the South latter part light breeze & pleasant weather under the ship out side left in by 5 1/2 14.38 South

320 Remarks on Tuesday September 1, 1835

first part of this day light breeze & pleasant weather under all sail steering to the South employed in ships duty at sunset fished topgallant sail at 1 P M wore ship to the north at 3 P M wore ship to the South at 5 P M made all sail & steered S E fine breeze & cloudy weather employed in ships duty left in by 5 1/2 18.12 South

321 Remarks on Wednesday September 2, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & cloudy weather under all sail steering South employed in ships duty middle & latter part of the day squally weather & rainy for the most part of the time evening & first to the North & then to the S W all night at daylight made all necessary sail & steered S by 7 P M at 8 P M saw the vessel at West low island so close this day rainy weather
