

322 On Board of the Ship Cadmus of Fairhaven William Crowell Master

Remarks on Thursday September 3rd 1835

this day begins with a fine breeze & rising by 10 AM lighted up & saw the island & called since we were steering for it got up the chain cables & bent them at sunset the pilot came off to us & piloted us into the harbour at 3 PM 6 PM came to anchor & fired the guns the ship's doctor of ship board came on board & was leaving to anchor in the harbour we stood short watches latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed in breaking out the four hole after dry earth & took up all the fresh water & went on shore with 27 cask & C

323 Remarks on Friday September 4th 1835

this day begins with fine weather all hands employed in stowing water in the blubber room at 5 PM brought off 27 cask of water & hoisted it in & stowed some of it in the four hole laying to anchor in talor harbour latter part of the day fine weather employed in getting off water & stowing it in the four hole & C

324 Remarks on Saturday September 5th 1835

this day begins with fine weather laying to anchor in talor harbour all hands employed in stowing water & blacked the larboard side of the ship with coal tar at 9 PM the schooner anchor got under way & stood to sea bound to Valparaiso with a load of shells & birds cap shore latter part of this day fine weather the starboard watch went & shore on liberty & the capts & officers went to meeting of the militia & cadets to end the day

325 Remarks on Sunday September 6th 1835

this day begins with fine weather starboard watch on liberty at 6 PM the officers came on board & the people stayed all night awake & latter part of the day fine weather larboard watch on liberty & the starboard watch employed in blacking the ship's benches & other kinds of work

326 Bound to the Society Islands & called Pimeo

Remarks on Monday September 7th 1835

this day begins with fine weather but cloudy the starboard watch employed in ship's duty at 4 PM heeled the ship to the larboard & worked the starboard lines latter part of this day cloudy weather & some rain starboard watch on liberty for 24 hours ends with small rain

327 Remarks on Tuesday September 8th 1835

this day begins with cloudy weather & small rain the starboard watch on liberty the larboard watch painted the bow ship & we had Jacob trip to him with old army that while we lay in this port latter part of this day fine weather the larboard watch on liberty & the starboard watch employed in getting off wood & painting the ship & C at 4 PM 11 AM began to rain got off one boat load of wood & stowed it away

328 Remarks on Wednesday September 9th 1835

this day begins with small rain laying in talor harbour in company with the ship India the larboard watch on liberty the starboard watch employed in painting the stern of the ship & blacked the benches & got off 4 boat load of wood at 5 PM finished painting the stern & took in the wood & stowed away in the hole latter part of the day fine weather starboard watch on liberty & the larboard watch employed in getting off wood & blacked the starboard benches & other various kinds of work & C

329 Remarks on Thursday Sept 10th 1835

this day begins with fine weather laying in talor harbour starboard watch at shore on liberty with the militia came & officers larboard watch employed in work about the ship latter part of the day fine weather the larboard watch on liberty & the starboard watch employed in work about the ship got some fruit & C

330 Remarks on Friday September 11th 1835

this day begins with fine weather laying in talor harbour employed in various kinds of work the larboard watch on liberty for 24 hours latter part of the day fine weather at 5 AM went on shore & took off 15 cask of water & the larboard watch commenced stowing in the four hole & the starboard watch on liberty the work runs as usual & got hatched by the natives the missionaries came on board of us & got dinner
