

331 On board of the Ship Cadmus of Fairhaven William Crowell Master

Remarks on Saturday, September 12, 1835

this day begins with fine weather lying to anchor in talos harbour the Starboard watch on liberty & the larboard watch employed in stowing water at 4 PM finished stowing down the water & washed off the decks & got ready for painting the ship latter part of this day fine weather at 5 PM the ship incline of new leaded went to sea from this port bound to other Zealand at 8 PM the larboard watch went on liberty & went to church on island on Sunday

332 Remarks on Sunday, Sept 13, 1835

this day begins with fine weather with one shower of rain the larboard watch on liberty at 5 PM some of the watch came on board & then went on shore to stay the night at sunset a small skiff with a skiff got under way & went to sea & left our skiff & us lying to anchor in talos harbour latter part of the day fine weather Starboard watch on liberty & the larboard watch employed in painting the ship & getting of one thing & another from the shore

333 Remarks on Monday, Sept 14, 1835

this day begins with fine weather the larboard watch employed in painting the ship & the Starboard watch on liberty middle & latter part of the day fine weather the Starboard watch employed in painting the ship & the larboard watch on liberty to ends this day fine weather

334 Remarks on Tuesday, Sept 15, 1835

this day begins with fine weather employed in painting the ship & the larboard watch on liberty at 4 PM finished painting the ship latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather larboard watch employed in getting of our potatoes from the shore & the Starboard watch on liberty

335 Remarks on Wednesday, September 16, 1835

this day begins with fine weather lying to anchor in talos harbour the larboard watch employed in getting of our potatoes from the shore & the Starboard watch on liberty at sunset all the liberty men came off to the ship at 10 PM 3 men took of dinner from a long keel of the ship & cleared for the woods & mountains latter part of the day fine weather all the natives were at evening for chocolate men at 11 PM from the dinner

336 Lying to anchor in Limes one off the Society Islands Talos harbour

Remarks on Thursday, September 17, 1835

this day begins with fine weather lying to anchor in talos harbour all the natives were at looking for the white men they had not found them at sunset at 4 PM called all hands & commenced heaving up our anchor at daylight got the anchor & stood to sea with a fair wind got out back of the keel & lay at back capt Crowell went on shore at 7 AM a boat came at long keel & brought our 3 men that run away from us the night before about sunset on the weather side of Limes at 11 PM capt Crowell came on board & brought the cook & paid 34 dollars for the 4 men we stood off from the land with a fair breeze under all sail bound up to Tahiti to ends this day

337 Remarks on Friday, Sept 18, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze under all sail at 4 past 2 PM tacked ship & stood in for the land at 4 tacked off at sunset pushed to gulunails & single reefed the topsails latter part of the day fine breeze & fairing clouds at 3 AM tacked ship in for the land we headed up for Tahiti harbour to ends this day

338 Remarks on Saturday, September 19, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fairing clouds standing in for Tahiti harbour at 2 PM the capt Crowell went on board of a American man of war to see if they would take a sick man by the name of Geist with and they refused taking him at 3 PM the boat came off to the ship & carried with on board of the ship of war to be examined & they refused taking him at 4 past 7 PM the boat came on board & brought with & Charles show the men that run away from us to Tahiti one of the Marguerite islands we kept off at 12 at night we lay with the main yard aback latter part of the day fine pleasant weather at daylight stood 4 PM under easy sail at 10 PM saw an island or head to ends this day fine weather

339 Remarks on Sunday, September 20, 1835

this 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather steering 70° N on bent our cables & stowed them away at sunset Mr. C. Lavelle Island bore SE from us distance 3 leagues we pushed main to top gulunails & reefed the topsails strong breeze & fairing clouds

latter part of the day fine breeze & flying clouds steering 70° N to ends this day
