Remarks on Sunday February 20, 1836

These 24 hours begins with light winds from the South & pleasant weather under all sail at 10 AM took ship to the Eastward & at 12 PM employed about the ship at 2 PM ran off our weather sheet at run down with 3 the four & 1/2 mizzen top gallant sail
 Latter part of the day fine breeze from the N.E. & breezy weather under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. & two ships steering to the N.W. & W. made this day
 Lat in by 20.46 South

502 Remarks on Monday February 29, 1836

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.E. & breezy weather steering to the S.W. at 10 AM down shortened sail & mizzen of the wind to the Eastward middle &
 Latter part of this day fine breeze & passing clouds under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. & mizzen employed in this duty taking up pipe sheets at 11 AM ran off our weather sheet steering to the S.W. by the wind Lat in by 23.17 South

503 Remarks on Tuesday March 1st 1836

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.E. & passing clouds under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. one ship in light employment in this duty cooher employed in taking up pipe sheets at 10 AM down shortened sail as usual
 Latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds under all sail employed about the ship nothing in sight Lat in by 25.33 South

504 Remarks on Wednesday March 2nd 1836

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.E. & passing clouds under all sail steering to the S.W. employed about the ship at 10 AM ran off ship steering to the South at 10 AM down shortened sail Latter part of this day equally weather attended with showers of rain by shells steering to the S.W. by the wind Lat in by 26.36 South

505 Remarks on Thursday March 3rd 1836

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.E. & flying clouds under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. by the wind at 10 AM took ship to the South & furled the main sail at 1 PM wore ship to the S.W. Latter part of the day fine breeze & flying clouds now & then a small shower of rain Lat in by 24.11 South

506 Remarks on Friday March 4th 1836

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.E. & under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. three squalls passing over - saw two weather squalls one of them very near to us at 10 AM down furled the main sail & worked reefed the four top sail
 Latter part of this day strong breeze & thick weather attended with rain steering to the S.W. by the wind under double reef top sails Lat in by 23.05 South

Remarks on Saturday March 5, 1836

These 24 hours begins with thick partly weather attended with rain at 3 PM furled the gill double reefed the main top sail & short reefed the mizzen top sail at 6 PM short reefed the four top sail heading to the N.E. the wind from the S.W. middle &
 Latter part of this day thick weather & raining by shells broke out the four hole after wood at 10 AM wore ship to the S.W. Lat in by 22.24 South

508 Remarks on Sunday March 6, 1836

These 24 hours begins with thick weather attended with rain by shells heading to the S.W. under short sail at 8 PM wore ship to the South & furled the gill middle &
 Latter part of this day thick weather & raining heading to the N.E. so ended this day Lat in by 23.12 South

509 Remarks on Monday March 7, 1836

These 24 hours part of these 24 hours thick raining weather wind from the S.W. heading to the N.E. at 8 PM it began to breeze on furled the main sail four & mizzen top sail & short reefed the main top sail like the four Phenon & not down the four & mizzen top gallant yard strong breeze & thick weather this day ends with thick weather & a plenty of rain lying too in rain at short reef main top sail & four Phenon heading to the N.E.
 Lat in by 24.00 South

510 Remarks on Tuesday March 8, 1836

These 24 hours commences with thick weather attended with a plenty of rain the wind from the S.W. heading to the N.E. under short reef main top sail & four Phenon took up the barboard boat on the upper rim at 8 PM it began to moderate & clear off the wind hauled to the S.W.
 Latter part of the day strong breeze & a large swell on attended with small showers of rain by shells at 8 AM called all hands & made all mizzening sail & steered to the S.W. by the wind Lat in by 25.14 South long by Chron 73.30

511 Remarks on Wednesday March 9, 1836

These 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the S.W. & a large swell on under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. by the wind at 10 AM down furled the gill & short reefed the four top sail middle &
 Latter part of the day strong breeze with a large swell on under all mizzening sail steering to the S.W. some passing squalls broke out the after hole after Wood & cross this day Lat in by 24.16 South
