

520 On Board of the Ship *Castles* of *Dimichum* *William Russell* *Master*

morning 21st begins with fine weather under all sail steering to the Westward
10 employ. I in morning down oil at dusk at night shorten sail & steered by the
starboard to the South & left off work & got supper

latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather at 5 PM called all hands
& made sail & steered to the westward finish. I steering off the four holes at
7 PM saw the Island of *Lower* under off decks & commenced hauling the cable
& Q. R. ends this day

521 Remarks on Saturday March 19th 1830

morning 21st begins with fine weather steering for Tongatabu at 9 PM the
pilot came on board & piloted us in the harbor at 4 PM came to anchor
& fueled the ship the ship's boats of *Old* *Red* for *capt* *Monk* by to
come here in this harbor with us *capt* *Monk* came on board of us
latter part of the day passing by going to anchor in *Monaga* *Denil* harbor
the harbor watch on liberty & went to church landward to day with the people at
shore to end this day

522 Remarks on Sunday March 20th 1830

morning 21st begins with good weather going to anchor the harbor watch on
liberty at 10 AM down took the men from the shore
latter part of the day calm going to anchor till 2 PM weather & shore & left it on
the beach & came on board & got dinner to end this day

523 Remarks on Monday March 21st 1830

morning 21st commenced with calm weather going to anchor at 1 PM our boat
went up to the devil's blow at trading for logs & *gunny* & Q at 7 PM the boat
came back with some logs & a few bowls were given with the boats
latter part of the day light winds & rainy weather by shells at 5 PM called
all hands & went at shore with our boat after a night of weather got the cash
rafts & the water too more boats came & helped tow it to the ship got on board
at 10 AM got breakfast & went on shore with two boats after wood with 8 men
we got the boats put down the natives declare war with they wounded 3
of our men very bad one of our boats put in to the shore & were all got in
but the 3 wounded men & we came on board the natives were all in an uproar
to end this day

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524 On the South Pacific Ocean Bound to Tongatabu Island

Remarks on Tuesday March 22nd 1830

morning 21st begins with light winds & some rain at 1 PM we got the ship under
way in company with the *Castles* & went down to the missionaries harbor while
on our passage down there the natives sent off our 3 men with our boats &
at part of the boats came with them at 2 PM came to anchor fired the guns
got dinner & then carry. I our 3 wounded men at shore to the doctor to
keep them wounded & left them at shore we hoisted in our weather & steam I at
latter part of the day got supper & the 3 officers had watch for the night
latter part of the day thick weather & rainy by shells part of our men
employ. I in cutting wood at shore at noon came off to dinner to end this
day

525 Remarks on Wednesday March 23rd 1830

morning 21st of this day thick weather & some rain by shells going to anchor
in *Vanuatu* men's road in company with the *Castles* our men employ. I
in cutting wood at shore & 3 of our wounded men at shore under the
doctor's care latter part of the day strong winds from the shore & rainy
weather at 5 PM called all hands & sent the top gallant down fore & aft
going to anchor with both anchors at head at 8 PM 5 men went at to
cut wood at 11 PM put in two boats we loaded them with wood & came on
board & got dinner to end this day

526 Remarks on Thursday March 24th 1830

morning 21st begins with light winds & some rain going to anchor with
the *Castles* at 2 PM I & 4 men went at shore to cut wood at dusk came on board
& gave with the *Castles* *capt* *Monk* was on board of us & *Mr* *McGowan*
went on board of the *Castles* rainy weather at 5 PM *capt* *Monk* went
on board of his ship & I turned in till 2 PM
latter part of the day more clear weather at 7 PM part of our men
went at shore to cut wood at 10 PM put in 3 boats after wood my four
men watch below to end this day

527 Remarks on Friday March 25th 1830

morning 21st begins with light winds from the NW fair weather going
to anchor at 1 PM 3 of our boats came on board with wood & got dinner were
the old king on board the dinner after dinner employ. I in splitting up the wood
& storing it away in the lower hole main &
latter part of the day light breeze from the NW at 7 PM 5 men went at
shore to cut wood at 11 PM put in 3 boats & got 3 boats loaded & got it all
the *Castles* got all of our wood to end this day
