Remains on Saturday March 28. 1838

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.E. & pleasant weather etc. /
 P.M. got on board with all of our wood & set it up & stowed it away, at 5
 P.M. I came off from the shore & brought some shells & game with the boats
 officer they came on board of & spent the evening laying to anchor & calm
 weather middle & latter part of this day light breezes & pleasant weather the Master &
 went ashore on liberty, & went to Mr. Perkins meeting there running
 the boats men & some of the officers were ashore to meeting, so ended this day,

529 Remarks on Londony March 27. 1830

these 24 hours commenced with light winds from the South & pleasant weather laying to anchor the bark went to watch on liberty, at 5 PM the blowing of South things came on board & had at 10 PM at 10 AM down took of all the men from the shore left Kunkin placed the evening on board of us

Earlier part of these 24 hours light winds & fine weather at 8 ed M weighed our anchor & stood to sea in company with the Cortes with ed Pilot on board at 11 ed M got out line of the reef got dinner & Rt Mtr brewer & 2 natives pilots ed Rhore on an island so they could get home 2 miles this day

530 Remains on Monday, March 20th 1830

35. Remarks on Monday March 20th 1880
 The 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NE & fine weather - laying
 off back out side of the bar at 2 PM came on board from the shore we
 weighed & forward & stowed out the East side of the jetty & under all bark in company
 with the boats & were out before we were taken on board of us to
 land him to the Society Islands by the name of West Point hole watches
 we had a number of our men & a horse & our stores & anchor & middle
 latter part of the day fine breeze & fine weather steering to the NE at 7 AM the
 boats sailed ship to the NE at 9 AM we had a small party of the form &
 more to get out sent watch employed in the boat & craft so ends this day at
 noon sailed ship to the NE at 1 PM left in by ship 20th 1880 South

534 Remarks on Sunday March 29. 1836

53x Bismarck on December 30, 1914
 their 24 hour legions with at fine breeze & fine weather steering to the N. W.
 out of sight of the Coast at 3 PM. Saw the Coast the bar to the landward
 in afternoon to the ~~west~~ middle & latter part of the day light winds & fine
 weather in light of Coast at 7 AM. heard a school of large whales at 10 AM
 hauled 8 boats & got part to the Starboard breast hauled out the line & at
 head of the waist boats line & parted it & the whale came for line over
 chased him but could not get up with him gave up the chase & come on
 board at noon to cross this day light breeze under all sail steering to the
 South by the wind

532 Lying to Anchor at the Island of Bullo Tongataboo

Minutes on Monday March 30. 1838

three 24 lbs bags of white light beads from the Eastward & 24 lbs of seal
at 1 P.M. saw a large whale off our weather beam 5 miles off at 2 P.M. hauled
3 boats & got back to the Markham boat & killed him to the waist boat at 4 P.M.
took him at long haul & raised him up over the beam between decks & threw it
back of it in the main hatchway at dusk got three with it & took the remainder
of it on the quarter deck. Throat & tail & leg by the wheel & head throat throat
matches at sun down saw a ship at our beam leaving up bow by the wind
in sight of Cove Island better part of the day calm weather & more hot at
dusk light call all hands & got ready to enter our whale & commenced
cutting the head saw one ship we called at the coast records this day all hands
employed in cutting in whale in sight of Cove  28.70

533 Remarks on Thursday, March 31, 1838

their 2nd hour begins with light butchery broves & calves on a large fire cutting
in which at 7 AM finished boiling the carcasses of Phippen & let the water to the
Husband watch on each placed at the dishes then I saw the cutting given
& let the hour end & filled & placed the dishes by the wind with at light
brow & fine weather at 10 AM made at fire & commenced boiling, had to
cutting, lunch at 12 noon at 4 AM was back at small of rain would down the
fire at 4 AM commenced boiling, body finished boiling, had third day made with
light winds from the N. N. W. in light & breeze

434 Remarks on Strides, April 1st 1838

There Liberty begins with light breeze from the Westward & fine weather boiling lively
watch below in sight of the Island of Loos at 2 PM saw a school of large whales
off our bow at 2 past 3 PM lower 2 & 3 boats & got part to the Starboard boat
& then got part to him with the Starboard boat & got him to the Starboard & then had the
whale harpoon cut off the Starboard boat line he took all of the Starboard boat
line & at part of the wait boat line & passed it & at the wheel it came on
dash come on board got bigger & at the watch boiling blubber fine weather
laying with the main tacked to the mast heading to the SE wind from the
SE by S part of the day light breeze & fine weather boiling at 7 AM we
had our shower of rain one ship in sight to the leeward of us at 9 past 11 AM
finished boiling out our whale & washed off deck at 12 saw a school of
whales got dinner & ended this day
