

535 On Board of the Ship *Caracas* of *Greenwich* *William* *Green* *Master*

Remarks on Saturday April 9 1836 60 fms
 This 24 hours begins with fine weather at 10 AM lower 2 boats after whales & got
 back to the large whale to the West boat & hauled the line & lost the whale was
 chased to him till 5 PM & got back to our other whale to the Harbour boat & lost
 him to the West & Harbour boat at 7 PM got him at long line & put on
 the fluke rope then we lost got supper & went to bed watches for the night
 moderate weather out of sight of land at 4 AM called all hands & took up from
 dry cask between decks & stored some of our oil down there at 4 past 5 AM commenced
 cutting on our whale saw at this off our weather began billowing this day ends with
 fine weather cutting in the whale no distance to day

536 Remarks on Sunday April 10 1836

This 24 hours begins with fine weather & at 10 AM lower 2 boats after whales & got
 cutting in our whale made rail & moved to the Eastward by the wind at 3 PM
 made a fire & commenced billowing head with 2 of line for the West boat at 4 PM
 down finished cutting the junk & wore ship to the West by the wind at 4 past 7 PM
 at the West boat we watch on deck middle & latter part of this day light breeze &
 pleasant weather billowing at 10 AM saw the Island of Java & one ship was stored
 in fire the land the ship was at billowing whale ends this day fine weather

537 Remarks on Monday April 11 1836

This 24 hours begins with light breeze from the West & pleasant weather billowing
 cutting in for lower one ship off our lee beam at 8 AM saw another ship stored out
 from the land & the two ships came together for a gun at 7 PM finished billowing
 washed off the decks & wore ship to the Eastward & stored short watch on deck
 latter part of this day fine breeze & fine weather off the East side of Java at 5 AM called all
 hands & commenced breaking out the four peaks to throw down on reef & once this
 day throwing down oil & two ship to the leeward of us

538 Remarks on Tuesday April 12 1836

This 24 hours begins with fine weather & at 10 AM lower 2 boats after whales & got
 in the four peaks in sight of Java & ship to the leeward of us at 10 AM down left off work
 got down about 30 barrels of oil latter part of the day strong breeze from the West &
 flying clouds steering to the West out of sight of land at 10 AM called all hands & commenced
 down oil in the four holes & ends this day

539 Remarks on Wednesday April 13 1836

This 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the West & flying clouds steering to the
 West all hands employed in throwing down oil in the four holes at 10 AM down left off
 work & stored short watch on deck latter part of this day strong winds & rough weather in sight of Java all hands
 employed in throwing down oil in the four holes at 11 AM saw a ship off our
 lee beam & ends this day

540 Remarks on Thursday April 14 1836

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the Eastward & rough weather
 off to the West of Java heading to the West all hands employed in throwing down
 oil at 8 AM kept off to the West of Java at 10 AM got all of our oil
 stored down at 4 past 10 PM the ship *Plamblow* of *Antwerp* & *capt* *Mc*
cleave 7 months out 200 cwt small went on board of him at 10 AM down left
 off work came on board brought the news we did not finish throwing off all
 of our cask left off work & got supper heading to the West with a strong breeze &
 rough weather under double reef top sails in middle &
 latter part of the day strong breeze from the Eastward & rough weather steering to the
 South by the wind at day light saw the remble of our weather down the
 South ship to the West & went out of sight at 10 AM finished throwing off
 the lower hole & began to throw the flukes between decks & ends this day
 left in by day 22.5 fms

541 Remarks on Friday April 15 1836

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the Eastward & rough weather steering
 to the South by the wind at 9 AM finished throwing between decks & washed off
 decks at 7 PM closed reef the four & middle top sail middle &
 latter part of this day strong winds & flying clouds heading to the West by the
 wind under short sail all hands employed in washing these down
 left in by day 23.5 fms

542 Remarks on Saturday April 16 1836

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the Eastward & rough weather steering
 to the West by the wind under short sail all hands employed in washing these
 down at 10 AM down left off work the *gillie* & *the four* *Sherran* *middle* &
 latter part of this day strong winds & rough weather steering to the West
 by the wind under short reef top sails & ends this day rough weather
 left in by day 24.5 fms

543 Remarks on Sunday April 17 1836

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the Eastward & rough weather
 steering to the West by the wind under short sail at 10 AM down left off work
 latter part of this day strong winds & rough weather steering to the South at 7 AM
 at 10 AM down left off work & ends with rough weather & flying clouds
 left in by day 25.5 fms
