here I have begins with fine weather. At 10 o'clock from the P.B. Steaming to the P.B. by the wind all hands employed. In Steaming down oil at 8 P.M. Paid off ship off our weather. In Steaming to the P.B. by the wind at 10 o'clock got down all of the oil & finished Steaming off the four hole & had some cash left on deck. After part of this day fine weather at 8 P.M. called all hands made sail & commenced breaking out the blubber room & got out a pipe of water & threw off a gun in water of decks. Paid off ship to the windward of us sailing at 11 P.M. took ship to the P.B. but in 3 off 27.52 South

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the NE & fine whole weather unless we
nearly cease but pleasing to the eye by the arrival of ship to the windward of us at
boiling we are employed. I in taking up black earth at two down station. I sail

Remarks on Saturday April 23. 1830

there 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & fine weather on Monday 11th Paul starting to
 the N. by the wind on ship to the windward of us all hands on deck in washing
 there down at sun down made the main top gallant sail at 8 PM. Made the ship
 Elizabeth Masbuck of Warrenton capt. Kirkist 23 months out 1900 barrels of oil
 capt. Crowell went on board of him to get the news at 9 PM capt. Crowell came on
 board & we steamed to the North latter part of the day fine weather & a fine breeze
 at 9 AM called all hands & made Paul the Elizabeth Masbuck was 2 points on
 our weather & quarter 10 miles off at sun rise we saw a large school of large
 whales off our weather beam headed to the larboard got breakfast & brewed 3 brews
 & let our collies to the mizz to gallant head for the other ship the Starboard boat
 got fast to a large whale & killed him & the waist boat & Starboard boat took turn
 to him the Starboard boat went to the ship to beat her to the windward they saw
 whales off the larboard the larboard boat hauled for them & the waist boat followed
 after her we chased the whales in company with the Masbuck's boats the whales were
 going very quick we gave up the chase & came on board capt. Crowell had got
 the whale at long side & got ready for cutting the other ship Starboard
 the whale Bends there 24 hours latter 3 days 27th 40th 24th

this Phoenix begins with a fine breeze & passing clouds with it while at Long River
 at about 1 PM commenced raining in the whole at 5 PM got the head off & the
 body all in the bin was 4 hours right and shorter a tail & stand short weather. I
 let the head lay at Long River all night at a light color all hands & reached down
 to the head & cut off the junk & got back but at 11 at 13 learned the head & skin not
 dark at 12 past 11 made a fire & began to boil the head & care this way, mess with
 a fine breeze from the north & changing weather during 12 & 13 finished short but
 better by 12 27.50 past

Here the morning begins with a fine breeze from the North & cloudy weather and
 about half pasting 9 o'clock all hands employed in building heard & entering gun
 at 10 AM finished entering gun & washed off decks at sundown turned up 11 bars &
 & had at 6 o'clock P.M. set the watch the last round watch on deck first
 latter part of the day strong breeze from the East & cloudy weather building
 at 2 o'clock had a shower of rain at 3 o'clock saw at 4 o'clock the weather
 clearing to the East by the wind at 7 o'clock called out the watch got breakfast
 & made sail starting to the SE exposed the sail & washed off decks at 9 o'clock
 saw a number of large whales off our lee beam going to the windward
 lowered 3 boats & sent 2 on whale to the windward but did not get back
 to him gave up the chase & came on board Bowers this day latter in 7 AM 20.22
