

584 Remarks on the Ship Commanded of Fairhaven William Brewster

Remarks on Saturday May 21st 1838

these 24 hours begins with strong winds from the Eastward & showers of rain all hands employed in stowing away weather at 8 PM finished stowing the weather middle & latter part of the day fresh gales & rainy weather the ship being of Salem dragged half way of New South anchor down to cross the day

585 Remarks on Sunday May 22nd 1838

first part of this day fresh gales from the Eastward & rainy weather lying to anchor in the Bay of Islands the ship being & blowing by dragged there anchor at 8 PM the wind hauled to the NE & began to moderate at 9 PM the wind hauled to the SE & cleared off fine weather latter part of the day strong breeze from the South & clear weather at 10 AM the ship James Morrison of Hudson got under way & stood to her 10 months out 800 barrels of oil 30 casks this day the Master and watch at home on Liberty & the barboard watch employed in getting off potatoes from the store

586 Remarks on Monday May 23rd 1838

these 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the South & flying clouds lying to anchor in the Bay of Islands in company with 8 ships the Master and watch at home on Liberty & the barboard watch employed on board of the ship & spent the evening on board of the barboard watch & all hands at 12 at night came on board latter part of the day clear weather & a fine breeze from the South the barboard watch on Liberty the Master and watch employed on board of the ship at 10 PM the barboard watch of Patterson got under way & stood to her

587 Remarks on Tuesday May 24th 1838

these 24 hours begins with fine weather the barboard watch on Liberty the Master and watch employed on board all the captains got supper here & spent the evening latter part of the day fine breeze from the SE & clear weather all hands employed in getting off weather & wood the ship was at Boston Schooner came to anchor here & under Borden this day

588 Remarks on Wednesday May 25th 1838

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the South & clear weather all hands employed in getting off wood & weather at 10 PM the ship Phlegbey weighed anchor & stood to her latter part of the day fine breeze from the South at 9 AM the ship Legion of Salem weighed anchor & stood to her Borden this day all hands employed about nothing & an other

589 Laying to anchor in the Bay of Islands New Ireland

Remarks on Thursday May 26th 1838

these 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the South & clear weather all hands employed on board about nothing and another latter part of this day fine weather lying to anchor in the Bay of Islands New Ireland in company with 4 ships all hands employed on board of the ship Borden this day

590 Remarks on Friday May 27th 1838

these 24 hours begins with fine weather & at 12 light breeze from the SE at 1 PM commenced heaving up our anchor at 2 PM got the anchor & stood to her eight casks & cask Procyon must down with us got down at Borden & took her to the ship of New South capt price 32 months out with 2100 barrels of oil bound in to the Bay of Islands capt price & capt may have went on board of him we had to land out the day with a light breeze & fine weather under all sail on board the Master and watch at home & it arrived & cleared into the docks & stood to her watches engine calloghowness crewed from us the barboard watch had the last Liberty & Borden in this port at 7 PM finished the four & more to get out at 11 PM the main

latter part of the day strong breeze from the SE & gradually weather at 9 PM reefed the four & five to sail at 8 PM reefed the main to sail & cleared reefed the four to sail on board the ship & Borden this evening for watch employed in getting the boats & cask Borden this 24 hours

591 Remarks on Saturday May 28th 1838

these 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the SE & gradually weather under all necessary sail steering to the SE by the wind hauled to the SE by the watch employed in getting the boats & cask Borden this 24 hours

latter part of the day strong breeze & bearing by sails under all necessary sail steering to the SE by the wind on board the ship & Borden this evening for watch

592 Remarks on Sunday May 29th 1838

these 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the SE & gradually weather steering to the SE at 2 PM finished mending the ship & sent it to the Bay of Islands & all logs made & latter part of the day strong breeze from the SE & bearing under all necessary sail steering to the SE by the wind
