

834 On board of the ship Cadmus & Captain William Crowell Master
 Arrived on Monday August 29, 1835

Two hours began with fine breeze from the S.E. & passing clouds
 stirring up nothing in sight at last down North D. Sail & lifted to the
 wind made 2000 by the compass latter part of the day fine weather at 8
 PM called all hands & put up the fore & main topgallant yards & made
 sail & moved to the S.W. by the wind at 7 hour two large whales 4 miles
 off our weather beam heading off at westward at 8 down 3 boats
 & got fast to the barboard boat & fast to the line & then I got fast to him
 & the barboard boat pulled up to him & secured him & got over board of the
 boat all cut off but the hull was took all the men in the two other boats
 & killed the whale & then the catch picked up the lower boat & the vessel
 boat took the whale to the ship at 11 at 11 we got the whale fluke at 12
 down at 12 fast 11 got the stores laid on the crew & got dinner for this day
 left in by day 22. 1835

835 Remarks on Tuesday August 30, 1835

Two hours began with fine weather & at fine breeze from the S.E. at 10 AM
 commenced cutting on the whale head at 2 PM saw at ship at sundown
 the got very near to us down 3 boats & came on board of us & was east
 several ship's attention 7 months out 170 barrels at 7 PM we got the head off
 & the body in one time the blubber off & fast to him in the flukes & at back
 of the small with three North D. sail & got up him & moved short weather
 at 10 PM with Russell went on board of his ship above fuller got two letters
 from Fairhaven latter part of the day fine weather at 5 PM called all hands
 & commenced cutting off the fork took it in & got down blood at 10 took the
 head skin in made sail & moved to the S.W. by the wind 3 miles in sight
 at 11 saw down having come from us & came this day

836 Remarks on Wednesday August 31, 1835

Two hours began with at fine breeze from the Eastward & fine weather in sight
 in sight at 1 PM commenced boiling head & cutting back at 8 PM the
 watch the Northward watch on deck at 7 PM were this to the S.E. at 12 got
 all the head out of the hots & commenced boiling body
 latter part of the day fine breeze & some clouds of several ships in sight at 8 PM we
 fast to the windward & an English ship cutting in at whales head at 9 were
 this & moved in towards come & the barboard watch went below boards this
 day left in by day

837 Cruising off to the North-east of Cape Cod

Remarks on Thursday September 1, 1835

Two hours began with at fine breeze & clearing weather boiling body
 turning to the east too late in sight at sundown 3 watches below bar
 two hours at 5 PM we cut off & took the ship George dinton & Johnson capt.
 carried gaming with the william gift of Fairhaven with dog & cat & several
 went on board of them at 8 PM Capt. Crowell came on board & secured
 forward & moved to the S.E. for west head 2000 barrels 32 months
 out George dinton had 1200 24 months out middle & latter part of
 the day fine weather at 5 PM finished boiling at 7 PM called all
 watch got breakfast & washed our decks & made sail forward & back
 in sight & moved this day westward & down left in by day 22. 34. but

838 Remarks on Friday September 2, 1835

Two hours began with fine weather & some foggy several ships in
 sight at 5 PM the attention of Fairhaven run off & then we cut
 moved some on board Capt. Crowell went on board of him & about
 the evening we run off to another ship to the leeward of us & the
 Capt. of him went on board of him the mate of the other went
 left in here & about the evening at 10 PM Capt. Crowell came on board
 the ship was the william gift of Fairhaven Capt. Crowell made it mistake
 & came on board of us & then went on board of his ship
 latter part of the day fine weather at 5 PM called all hands made
 sail & moved to the Eastward & commenced breaking out the oil
 hole to store down our oil 1 ship in sight we took up all the
 meat & put it down the blubber room 59 barrels to make this day
 all hands working in the evening down oil in the after hold
 left in by day 23. 17 but

839 Remarks on Saturday September 3, 1835

Two hours began with at fine breeze from the S.W. & fine weather turning
 to the Eastward by the wind one ship in sight all hands working in the evening down
 oil at 4 PM saw a large whale but it being night we did not lower
 for him at last down left of wind & Northward to be got down too thick of the oil
 latter part of the day fine breeze from the North & rising weather stirring down
 oil in the after hold one ship in sight we were stirring & at 11 PM got
 all the oil down & commenced blowing of with the meat & made sail
 & made this day left in by day 22. 50 but
