

766 Remarks on the Ship Cadmus of Lieutenant William Cornwall

Remarks on Saturday November 19, 1837

These 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the ENE & flying clouds leading to the SE & under double reef to hauls sailing on westward below the cockpit empty. I in sitting up to the 2 PM. Sun too high off our bow at 3 PM called the watch covered the oil & washed out the double-reef at 4 we had 4 & 1/2 shovels of the Britisher Mitchell & the Captain of the Britisher they were at gunning the Mitchell got finished drilling two whistles kept on well went on board of her the Captain had 18 PM barrels 20 from the out at 9 PM light vessel got on board & we all moved to the boats by the wind at 10 we finished drilling & sailed off the oil from the cockpit at 12 called the Captain & watch & they divided the time strong breeze & sailing hands

Later part of the day strong breeze & cloudy weather at 1 PM called the watch & finished washing off decks got breakfast & some tea each of our beds the fire & some tobacco & the Captain's watch went below & the Mitchell's watch empty. I in building the lead side of the boat & put in the cash

767 Remarks on Sunday November 20, 1837

These 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from the Eastward & some small rain at 8 AM 12 were high to the South at 10 AM it cleared off & the Captain's watch common & working the lead at 2 PM called the Captain's watch & turned down 3 ships of lead took it all at her own were high to the SE & got the Captain's watch started for the night later part of the day fine breeze & some cloudy under all mauling fair steering to the SE nothing in sight

Left in 2 off 23.47 South

768 Remarks on Monday November 21, 1837

These 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the SE & sailing clouds steering to the SE & at sun down faded the light & fair weather later part of the day fine weather at 5 PM called all hands made sail & commenced working our oil & having it down the four hatchways between decks at 11 PM it cleared all the oil this day comes with fine whist weather & nothing in sight

Left in 2 off 22.20 South

769 Remarks on Tuesday November 22, 1837

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These 24 hours begins with fine whist weather & some cloudy steering to the North all hands empty. I in showing of the empty cash at 3 PM went the lower hole at 5 PM saw of this off our weather some steering to the SE at 10 AM clouds shorted. I laid at 11 PM were high to the SE

Later part of the day fine breeze & cloudy weather made sail & later to the SE & empty. I on board the Britisher took down boat & put them back together the one of them was a stone & put them back together & made one double & later one of the old barrels the day ends empty. I on them at 12 saw even off our weather some were high to the wind to the SE

Left in 2 off 21.42 South

770 Remarks on Wednesday November 23, 1837

These 24 hours begins with strong breeze & cloudy weather empty. I in sitting up the Britisher & later the Britisher at 10 PM took a ship to the South at 11 PM saw of this off our weather some steering to the SE

Later part of the day fine breeze & cloudy weather at 6 PM took a ship to the North empty. I in mending the main to haul & later the Britisher & later the Britisher at 9 PM the Britisher the Britisher paper to the Captain's watch & later steering to the SE & the wind some

Left in 2 off 22.30 South

771 Remarks on Thursday November 24, 1837

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the SE & cloudy weather at 1 PM took a ship to the SE empty. I on board at 2 PM the Mitchell's went out of sight at 4 PM we got back of the Britisher & later the Britisher at 10 PM took a ship to the SE at 11 PM took a ship to the SE

Left in 2 off 22.47

772 Remarks on Friday November 25, 1837

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & cloudy weather steering to the SE empty. I in mending the main to haul & looking off the Britisher & later the Britisher at 10 PM took a ship to the SE

Later part of the day strong breeze & variable & thick weather & some rain & shells empty. I in washing down at 9 PM & later the Britisher the Britisher thick weather & rain. Left in 2 off 22.45 South
