Three 24 hours begins with squally weather & shells all hands employed in
ripping up the sheeting & making the deck tight the Mass in the forenoon
& put them on the main deck latter part of the day strong wind from
the S.W. & heavy rain & shells the last hour watch of three on liberty
the Harbour watch on board at night the main deck yellow
rigging & make this day lying to anchor

1016 Remarks on Friday July 28th 1837

Three 24 hours begins with strong wind from the S.W. & heavy rain the
last hour watch on liberty the Harbour watch on board at night
at night of the Harbour side of the ship & the rain detained us from
hauling any more stores the middle watch & about 10 at night the
last hour watch all got on board latter part of the day rain & shells
the Harbour watch on liberty & the last hour watch on board
the day ends with clouds of rain & cool weather

1017 Remarks on Saturday July 29th 1837

Three 24 hours begins with squally weather & rain by shells the Harbour
watch at three on liberty at 8 P.M. the Harbour watch all got on board
latter part of the day fine weather the last hour watch of three on liberty
I had to move one man all day all the officers of the Jackson & Mr. Hughes
& Mr. Gault went to church & they all got dinner & made this day

1018 Remarks on Sunday July 30th 1837

Three 24 hours begins with fine weather the last hour watch of three on liberty
at 8 P.M. they all got on board with the Harbour watch
latter part of the day all hands employed on board some of the forenoon
& second for black streaks on it & last the main mast topmast
& lower the ship at night the main deck yellow rigging

1019 Remarks on Monday July 31st 1837

Three 24 hours begins with fine weather all hands employed on board
hauling the main mast topmast at 4 P.M. last the
forenoon got off one ton of potatoes & stored them away
latter part of the day fine weather all hands employed on board
the day ends with fine weather

Three 24 hours begins with fine weather all hands employed on board
about one thing and an other lying to anchor in company with

P.M. I came on board latter part of the day fine weather & heavy thunder
& lightning the last hour watch on liberty the Harbour watch on board
the day ends with fine weather

fast at night on board at 8 P.M. I left the ship & went to the
