Wednesday Aug 8 1872
Latter part of this day took the anchor
and stood out of the harbor of New
Bedford and so ends.

Thursday Aug 9
First part of this day good breezes from
the S W employed in beating out - Middle
part the same employed in coiling
new lines & getting the boats ready.
pilot left at 7 P.M. Broke out - water
and so ends.

Lat 40.05 Friday Aug 10
First part of this day light breeze
steering to the S E Employed in getting the
boats and whaling gear ready broke out
water Middle and Latter parts the same.

Lat 40.34 Saturday Aug 11
First part of this day light breeze
steering S E Middle part the same Latter
part strong breezes and squalls from the
S W Broke out 20 1/2 yards of chilling
and cut three new boat sails. also stowed.

Sunday Aug 12
First part of this day squally took in
the light sails Middle part the same
Latter moderate made sail saw one sail
Wind S W steering S E and so ends.

Monday Aug 13
First part of this day strong breezes from
the S W ship steering S E Middle and
Latter parts the same Employed in making
new boat sails and various other jobs
and so ends this day.
