

Monday Sept 3 1872

Lat 38.05 First part of these 24 hours still blowing ship trying to work up to the island Middle part the same Latter part moderating. Employed in ships duty and so ends.

Tuesday Sept 4

Lat 37.47 First part of these 24 hours strong breeze and squally at day light made sail but had to take it in Middle part the same Latter part moderating Employed in ship duty broke out 4 1/4 bbls of flour and water ship on the starboard tack heading W by N and so ends Saw two sails.

Wednesday Sept 5

Lat 38.03 First part of these 24 hours light breeze Middle part the same Latter part good breeze from the NW ship working to the Northward Saw three sails. Set up the main rigging and so ends this day.

Thursday Sept 6

Lat 38.40 First part of these 24 hours fine weather and light breeze Middle and Latter parts the same at 10 A.M spoke the ship St George Capt Knowles three months out 100 barrels saw the islands of Rico and Flores and several grampus so ends.

Friday Sept 7

Lat 38.40 Long 29.06 First part fine weather Middle and Latter parts the same ship steering saw two sail and several grampus Broke out sugar and corn and bread sent down the rigging and yards and put up the hoops.

Saturday September 8, 1872

Lat 41.13 Long 28.10 First part of these 24 hours light breeze Middle and Latter parts the same. Ship steering NE wind NW Saw a large number of grampus and two sails set up the fore rigging at sun down took in the fore and mizen gallant-sails.

Sunday September 9

Lat 41.03 Long 27.36 First part of this day light breeze from the E ship steering NE Middle part baffling winds and squalls with rain Latter part wind hauled in to the N ship on the wind heading E by N. Saw several schools of grampus and two sails so ends.

Monday September 10

Lat 41.30 First part of these 24 hours light breeze from the SW Middle part the same Latter part wind W steering NE by E Saw two sails and several grampus Employed in the rigging Broke out water and so ends.

Tuesday September 11

Lat 43.51 Long 26.40 First part of these 24 hours good breeze from the SW ship steering NE by E Middle and Latter parts the same Saw several grampus. Employed in the rigging at sun down took in the light-sails and so ends this day.

Wednesday September 12

First part strong breeze from the SW steering N by E Middle part the same with fog at noon luffed too on the port-tack heading WNW Latter part blowing a gale ship under close reef top sails and so ends.
