

Monday Sept 24 1872
These 24 hours light breeze still boiling spoke a german big bound to Queenstown saw several sails and so ends this day.

Tuesday Sept 25
These 24 hours fine weather still boiling saw several sails about noon found the whale belonging to the Larboard boat took him a long side and cut him in lost the head finished at dark and started the works saved the line.

Wednesday Sept 26
These 24 hours fine weather Employed in cutting up the blubber and boiling saw several sails and so ends.

Thursday Sept 27
These 24 hours fine weather and light breeze ship heading NW still boiling spoke a big who wanted to know what the matter was and so ends.

Friday Sept 28
First part light breeze Middle part blowing on Larboard side strong breeze ship on the starboard tack heading SE at day light finished boiling Employed in cleaning ship and so ends.

Saturday Sept 29
First part of this light breeze with fog and rain Middle and Larboard parts the same at sun down hauled round to the E made all sail steering SW and so ends.

Sunday Sept 30 1872
First part of this day strong breeze from the E Middle and Larboard parts the same steering SW foggy and rain most of the day and so ends.

Monday Oct 1 1872
Lat 39.05 First part of this day moderate breeze with fog and rain. Middle and Larboard parts the same steering SW 1/2 W saw nothing and so ends.

Tuesday Oct 2 1872
First part of this day good breeze. Middle and Larboard parts light. at day saw Fayal kept off SW by S. at 4 P.M. lowered the starboard boat and the Captain went ashore returned again at 8 P.M. saw seven whales laying off and on and so ends.

Wednesday Oct 3 1872
First part strong breeze at day light stood in Middle and Larboard parts the same. Lowered the starboard boat and took the Captain and family ashore. discharged gale of oil and took in recruits at sun down stood out so ends.

Thursday Oct 4 1872
First part strong breeze at day light stood in Middle part the same at 5 P.M. took the Captain and family aboard and stood out with light airs and calms took one man off the rocks of Fayal and found one stowed away. Employed in washing ship inside saw several sails among them the German 240 of sperm this season and the Spanish 500 so ends.
