

Monday Feb 25 1873

First-part of this day light- standing off and on Employed in getting water got off 55 barrels of water so ends.

Tuesday Feb 26

First-part of this day light- breeze from the westward and heavy swell unable to get water sent the Larboard watch ashore on liberty. got off about 16 barrels of potatoes so ends

Wednesday Feb 27

First-part of this day good breeze got the watch off three left Thomas Foy. Robert Arnold. Manuel Lopez got off 63 barrels of water so ends.

Thursday Feb 28

This day strong breeze from the S W Employed in getting off potatoes and sending trade ashore. also sent the starboard watch on liberty. caught the deserters two returned peacefully one Thomas Foy swore the Captain's life put him in irons and so ends.

Friday March 1

First-part of this day blowing a gale. Middle part- the same at 7 A M. ^{stood} in but the weather being so bad the watch could not get off Latter part moderating stood in at 4 P.M. and got the watch excepting the second mate and so ends this day Bark Mary Franier and a schooner.

Saturday March 2-1873

First-part of this day strong breeze from the Eastward Middle part- the same Latter part- light-breeze. at day light stood in and got off some fresh meat. sent ashore three sets of oars and three steering oars, and other trade about 4 P.M. took the Captain and family aboard and stood out on the wind heading S by E. Broke out salt so ends.

Sunday March 3

Lat-20.18 First-part of this day light breeze from Long 167.40 the Eastward Middle and Latter parts the same heading I saw nothing so ends.

Monday March 4

Lat-32.01 First-part of this day light-breeze from Long 167.23 the ESE Middle and Latter parts the same Ship heading S to SSE. Saw nothing Employed in ship's duty. Thomas Foy still in irons and so ends.

Tuesday March 5

First-part of this day light-breeze from ESE heading S at 11 A.M. tacked ship heading N by E Middle part and Latter the same Saw one fin back. Employed in blacksmithing and so ends.

Wednesday March 6

First-part good breeze from the ENE Ship beating to the Eastward under all sail Middle and Latter parts the same Saw nothing. Weather thick and rainy Thomas Foy still in irons and so ends.
