

Monday May 27. 1873

First part of this day light-breeze and calm. Middle and latter parts the same at day light-hauled along side of the Elina & employed in breaking out and cooping and putting it aboard the Elina James Arnold and Mary Frasier arrived and so ends.

Tuesday May 28

James Kiley returned First part of this day light-breeze and frequent rain squalls. Still employed in breaking out oil and so ends.

Wednesday May 29

Discharged First part of this day light-breeze and the cooper calm. Middle and latter parts the same John Bowers still employed in discharging oil James sick. Arnold and Merlin arrived and so ends.

Thursday May 30

First part of this day good weather and light-breeze. Middle and latter parts the same. Finished discharging oil have put on board 552 barrels and 2 gallons and five barrels of slush. Emma C Jones arrived and so ends this day.

Friday May 31

These 24 hours fine weather and light-breeze. Employed in stowing the ground tier and getting off water and so ends.

Saturday June 1

These 24 hours fine weather and light-breeze finished the ground tier and got off a raft of water and dried the sails and so ends.

June 2. 1873 57

These 24 hours fine weather and light-air. Starboard watch ashore on liberty Thomas Foy and Robert Arnold deserted the ship.

Monday June 3

These 24 hours fine weather and light-air. Employed in setting up shooks and getting off water and so ends.

Tuesday June 4

These 24 hours fine weather and moderate breeze hove down and put on 17 sheets of copper and so ends.

Wednesday June 5

These 24 hours good weather and light-breeze. Employed in getting off water setting up shooks and painting ship so ends.

Thursday June 6

These 24 hours fine weather and light-breeze. Employed in setting up shooks and painting and stowing the middle tier between fore and main hatch and so ends.

Friday June 7

This day fine weather finished painting got off a raft of water. Still setting up shooks.

Saturday June 8

This day fine weather starboard watch ashore on liberty. Employed in stowing down and setting up shooks. sent a raft ashore. received 22 bags of potatoes and so ends.
