

Friday Sept-13-1873

Lat-24.08 First part of this day blowing strong from
Long 168.00 the SSW ship on the port-tack heading
to the Westward. Middle part the same
Latter part moderate. Repaired the up-
per main top sail. Saw two fin backs
Ship under lower top sails so ends.

Saturday Sept-14.

Lat-24.48 First part of this day light breeze from
Long 167.39 the SSW ship on the port-tack heading
W Middle and Latter parts the same
George about 8 A.M. raised a sail at noon sent
Flagg the starboard aboard and found the
off Out. schooner Mary Ann of Auckland Capt-
Dick. Stewart which was blown off off New
Zealand since the 8 of May. The schooner's
sails were all gone and the crew destitute
gave them 2 barrels water 60 pounds of
bread 50 pounds of Beef. 1 1/2 gallons of oil
1 barrel of yams 6 pounds Coffee and 1
pound of tea and an old fly pit. 5 needles
2 skins of twine and about 20 fathoms
of cordage and two old lashings and
1 1/2 pounds of tobacco. at sun down took
in sail and wore ship and saw another
sail and so ends this day.

Sunday Sept-15

Lat-24.50 First part of this day fine weather and
Long 167.24 light breeze from the N.W. ship steering S.W.
Middle and Latter part the same. Saw
one hump back and two sails about
two O'clock sent the Larboard boat about
of the Cambridge Capt. Hughes of San
Francisco 5 days out-bound to Melbourne
loaded with lumber and at sun down
took sail and so ends this day.

Monday Sept-16-1873

First part of this day good breeze and fine
weather wind W at day light made sail
and kept off S at noon luffed too on the
port-tack heading N by W. Middle and
Latter parts the same. Saw the ill fated sho-
ner heading to the N.W. and one fin back
Employed in making spun yarn. took the
starboard boat in and repaired her at
sun down tacked ship heading S.W. and took
in sail and so ends this day.

Tuesday Sept-17

Lat-25.00 First part of this day light breeze from the
Long 167.29 N.W. by W at day light made all sail. Ship
on the port-tack heading S.W. by S. Middle
and Latter parts the same. Broke out
shooke finished the starboard boat and
put her out. Saw several fin backs at
sun down took in sail and so ends.

Wednesday Sept-18

Lat-26.14 First part of this day light breeze from
the N.W. ship heading S.W. by W Middle part
strong breeze and squally took in the light-
sails and furled the main sail and upper
fore top sail and close reefed the mizen.
Employed in making spun yarn. Cooper
setting up shookes. Broke out sugar. Latter
part wind light-weather rainy wore ship
at sun down took in sail and so ends.

Thursday Sept-19

Lat-26.07 First part good breeze from S ship heading
Long 167.34 ESE at noon kept off steering N. at 4 P.M. ste-
ring N.W. Middle and Latter parts the same
Cooper setting up shookes at sun down took
in and luffed too on the port-tack so ends.
