

Sunday April 13-1873

These 24 hours fine weather and and light breezes from the NE. part of the crew ashore at sun down all returned and so ends.

Monday April 14

These 24 hours cloudy with frequent rain squalls. Employed in filling and rafting water. and stowing down. painted the mizen top sail yard and so ends this day.

Tuesday April 15

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes Employed in filling water. got off three cords of wood and so ends this day.

Wednesday April 16

These 24 hours strong breezes from the NW with rain. filled a raft of water and so ends.

Thursday April 17

These 24 hours strong breezes from the NW got off a raft of water and stowed it in the after hold and so ends this day.

Friday April 18

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes from the SE. Received per. Steamer Murry from Auckland 3 tons of potatoes 1 ton of bread 1 ton of flour. 4 kegs of Butter. 672 lbs of sugar and some small stores. Sent 44½ gallons of sperm oil to Auckland per. Steamer. Murry. and so ends this day.

Saturday April 19

These 24 hours fine weather and strong breezes from the W. Employed in setting up shooks and placing the tank and so ends this day.

Sunday April 20-1874

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes from the SW. and so ends this day.

Monday April 21

These 24 hours light breezes and fine weather Employed in setting up shooks and putting them ashore and so ends this day.

Tuesday April 22

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes Employed in filling water and setting up shooks and so ends this day.

Wednesday April 23

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes Employed in filling water. and setting up the rigging and taring and so ends.

Thursday April 24

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes sent the boats fishing. The ship waiting for an opportunity to ship oil. Walter Phillips the steege boy deserted, and so ends this day.

Friday April 25

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes. painted the larboard boat inside and cold lard the ships bende. Sent a cask of oil containing 172 gals per Steamer to Auckland.

Saturday April 26

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes. Employed generally. Ship waiting for a chance to ship oil. Walter Phillips returned of his own accord and so ends.
