

Monday June 15-1875

These 24 hours fine weather and good breezes from the E.S.E. Employed in filling water and trading with the natives and so ends.

Tuesday June 16

These 24 hours fine weather and good breezes. got off a raft of water. and stowed it and so ends this day.

Wednesday June 17

These 24 hours fine weather and light breezes. sent the starboard watch ashore last night three Feeje men Tom. Dick. and Harry deserted the ship. got off two boat-loads of wood and stowed it between decks. Still trading with the natives and so ends this day.

Thursday June 18

These 24 hours fine weather a light-breezes sent the port watch ashore and all returned at 10 P.M. got off one boat-load of wood and stowed it and traded with the natives and so ends this day.

Friday June 19

These 24 hours fine weather and light-breezes got off three boat-loads of wood and stowed it. and traded with the natives. At sun down Mr Alexander went ashore with a boat crew and Frank Thomas. Peter Enos Joseph King and George Back deserted and so ends this day.

Saturday June 20-1875

These 24 hours fine weather and good breezes got two boat-loads of wood. and traded with the natives. Sent a boat to look for the runaways. with out success and so ends this day.

Sunday June 21

These 24 hours fine weather and light-breezes Part of the crew ashore. sent a boat ashore after the runaways and they all returned of their own accord. Put George Back Frank Enos. and Peter Thomas in irons and so ends this day.

Monday June 22

These 24 hours fine weather and light-breezes sent the mate trading. Employed in trading with the natives. and getting ready to sail took Frank Thomas. Joseph King. and Peter Enos out of irons and so ends this day.

Tuesday June 23

These 24 hours fine weather and light-air The mate returned with about three tons of yams. stowed them away. the ship all ready for sea. and so ends this day.

Wednesday June 24

First part of this day good breezes and frequent rain squalls. The mate went ashore and got three men (natives) named John. Albert. James at 3 A.M. took the anchor and stowed out ship on the starboard tack heading N. Middle and latter parts the same. Took George Back out of irons let the four runaways cleaning the cables. Saw one sail and so ends this day.
