

Tuesday July 14-1875

First-part of this day good breeze from the E. Ship steering W. S. W. middle and latter parts the same. Saw two fin backs. Employed in turning in the main rigging. Saw nothing and so ends this day.

Wednesday July 15

First-part of this day good breeze and fine weather. ship steering W. by S. middle and latter parts the same. Just before dark saw a school of Blackfish lowered three boats and the starboard boat struck a porpoise. Employed in turning in the main rigging. at dark shortened sail and hauled back the fore yard and so ends.

Thursday July 16

Lat. 17° 11' Long 179° 41' First-part of this day light breeze from the E. & E. Weather fine. ship steering W. by S. middle and latter parts the same. Saw Blackfish. Employed in the main rigging. Robert Lee off duty sick so ends.

Friday July 17

First-part of this day light breeze from the E. Weather fine. ship steering W. by S. middle and latter parts the same. Employed in the main rigging. Saw several schools of Blackfish and so ends.

Saturday July 18

First-part of this day moderate breeze from the E. ship steering W. by S. middle and latter parts the same. About 10 A.M. raised Byron's Island about 2 P.M. luffed two and hauled back about 9 miles off shore. At sun down shortened sail ship on the wind heading N. so ends.

Sunday July 19-1875

First-part of this day light breeze and fine weather. at day light-made sail steering W. by S. middle and latter parts the same about noon passed Peru Island at sun down shortened sail. Peter Enos had trouble with the fourth mate put him in irons for a short time. Byron's Island in sight at day light and so ends this day.

Monday July 20

First-part of this day light breeze and fine weather. ship steering W. S. W. middle and latter parts the same. Employed in the rigging. Saw a school of porpoise. struck two and so ends this day.

Tuesday July 21

First-part of this day light breeze and fine weather. Wind from the E. ship steering North and West. middle and latter parts the same about 1 P.M. Saw Simpson Island run down to the weather point and hauled off shore on the Southern tack beat to windward during the night. saw porpoise. one fin back and a school of Blackfish and so ends this day.

Wednesday July 22

First-part of this day light breeze and fine weather. at daylight kept off steering N. W. middle part steering W. by S. latter part the same. Saw Simpson Island and a school of Blackfish and porpoise. Employed in the rigging. Started flour Beans. and a cask of Pork (12) and water at sun down hauled off shore and so ends this day.
